## Opening lead — queens of spades.

There is usually not much difference between playing a hand well and playing a hand perfectly, but that slight difference does occasionally have a decisive effect on the result.

South was in four hearts and West led a spade, taken with the ace. Realizing that he had four losers, one of which had to be avoided to make the contract, South decided to place his faith in the club suit. He hoped to build up an extra club trick by leading a low club from dummy towards the queen on the assumption that East had the king.

East cannot foil declarer by refusing to take the nine of hearts. South simply plays a low club from dummy and the outcome is exactly the same.

### Ambassador Welcomed

WARSAW (AP) — John A. Gronowski, new U.S. ambassador to Poland who is the grandson of Polish immigrants, was given a tumultuous welcome here by Poles shouting “long live the ambassador.”

Never had an ambassador been greeted this way on arrival in Warsaw. There were at least 1,000 Poles lined up on the platform when his train pulled into Warsaw's railway station.

As the former U.S. postmaster-general stepped from the train, the crowd broke into wild applause. Gronowski moved along the platform shaking hands at random.

Gronowski, who had visited Poland last year, then spoke to the crowd in Polish.

“I have been waiting to return to Poland,” he said. “I want to express my warm affection to the admirable Polish people.”

### John E. Lloyd Is Appointed

OTTAWA (CP) — John E. Lloyd, 57, former Liberal member of Parliament defeated by the Conservatives in Halifax riding, has been appointed a member of the National Harbors Board, it was announced here.

The appointment for 10 years in the job, with a salary of \$19,000 a year, is effective today.

A chartered accountant and former lecturer to senior students at Dalhousie law school Mr. Lloyd was twice mayor of Halifax—1943-45 and 1960-63.

He ran in the 1962 federal election and was defeated in Halifax, a two-seat riding. He was successful in the 1963 federal election but was defeated in a try for a second term in the Nov. 8 election.

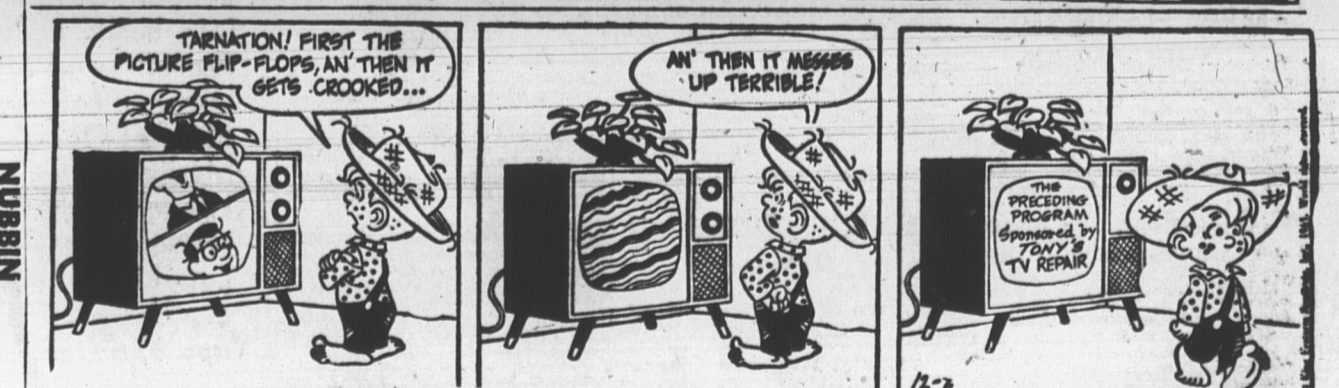
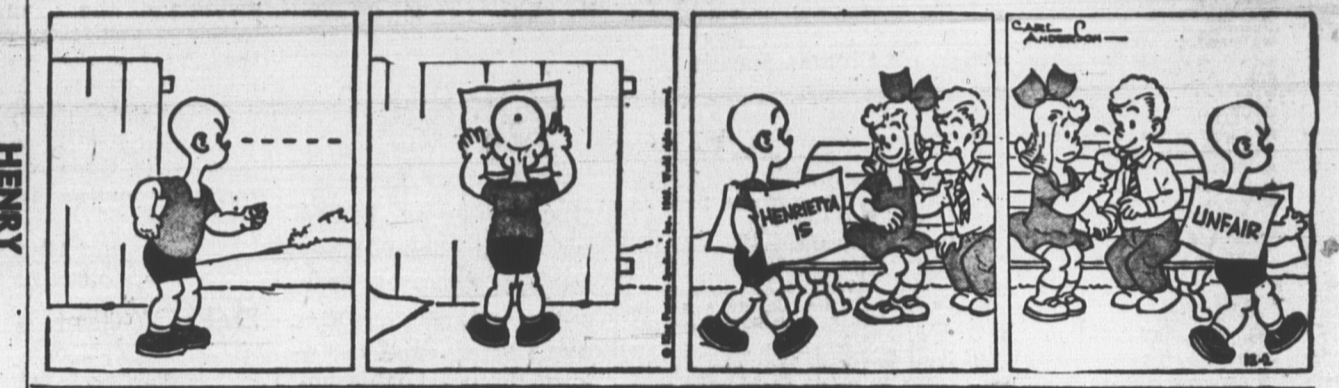
