

# American Firm Carving 20,000-Acre Farm In Alta.

DAWSON CREEK, B.C. (CP)—"We're not up here to show off... we're here to make money" says Glen Power, a husky Bahamian who is directing work at a 20,000-acre farm in the heart of the rich grain-growing Peace River country of north-eastern British Columbia.

"We bought the 21 sections comprising the South Peace stock farm last fall. Since then we've picked up 11 adjoining sections."

The farm, large even by Canadian standards where grain farms average about one section, is financed by Morrison Grain Company of Hastings, Neb.

The company also is developing a 55,000-acre tract in Louisiana for grain production.

Mr. Power arrived at the site at mile 36 on the Alaska Highway last fall. He estimates it will be three years before the entire acreage is brought under cultivation.

WHEAT MAIN CROP  
The company hopes to have 5,000 acres seeded to wheat and barley this spring. These will be the main crops, but livestock

production is a future possibility, too.

The company set out last fall to clear 10,000 acres by spring and has almost reached this target. Windrows of brush and fallen trees stretch almost six miles in places.

Crews have worked seven days a week since mid-November and only 1 1/2 days have

been lost because of cold weather.

Five 2,000-bushel granaries have been built at the farm headquarters and a grain elevator is planned at Taylor, B.C., seven miles north of the farm and on the Pacific Great Eastern Railway.

Foundations now are being laid for homes which will be used by the manager and foreman. Behind them bunkhouses for 30 men will be built.

EMPLOYED 20  
The farm has employed about 20 men throughout the winter. "I don't know how many we'll need here steady, but when we're running 24-hour shifts at seedtime and harvest we'll probably have a crew of 50 or more."

Mr. Power was reluctant to reveal long-term plans for the farm. "We'll get it all cleared and worked down before we decide what the operation will be."

"We've got a good line of registered Aberdeen Angus back in the U.S. now."

"I've got a lot of ideas, but I'm keeping them to myself for the moment. If they work out that'll be fine. If they don't, some fellow won't be saying, 'I told you so.'"

"The old timers look at what I'm doing and tell me I'm a fool, but I think this country needs some fools."

## Best Wishes Extended To Navy League

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson has extended his best wishes to the Navy League Week, May 2-3.

"The league's unwavering promotion of enlightened patriotism, love of Crown and country, and good citizenship in thousands of our youth, have been effective through four generations of Canadians," he said in a special message.

"This success has been built upon the constant support and tireless effort of Canadians in all walks of life—support and effort which I am confident will continue."

"It is my sincere hope that Navy League Week—while honoring our armed forces—will also elicit for the Navy League of Canada the public support and respect which have made its first 70 years so successful."

## Sharp Urges Bigger Role For Toronto

TORONTO (CP)—Trade Minister Sharp said here that Toronto must assume more responsibilities as the metropolitan centre for English-speaking Canadians, just as Montreal assumes such a role for French-speaking Canadians.

"I am not suggesting that other cities of Canada must take second place to Toronto and Montreal or that they are inferior in any sense."

"What I do suggest is that since Toronto is several times larger than any other English-speaking city it cannot help but have a greater influence upon the quality of Canadian life, particularly the English-speaking society."

Mr. Sharp, common member for Toronto-Eglinton, said in an address to the Empire Club of Canada that the vigor with which French-Canada is asserting itself is impressive.

But "too often I regret to say our response to this vigorous assertion by French-Canada is to inquire querulously: What does Quebec want and why is it asking so much?"

"It would be more becoming and more helpful if we were to welcome this evidence of surging vitality in our fellow citizens and to assert ourselves as English-speaking Canadians with equal vigor."

## Steel Strike Postponement Is Approved

PITTSBURGH (AP)—United Steelworkers policy-makers have approved a four-month strike postponement in exchange for an 11.5-cent-an-hour pay hike increase, overriding the opposition of some who wanted to reject the steel labor peace pact.

The agreement, which assures there will be no strike in the American basic steel industry until Sept. 1, was approved after strong debate behind closed doors for more than three hours.

Union opponents of the agreement, hashed out Monday by union president David J. McDonald and its chief industry negotiator, R. Conrad Cooper, called it a "tin cup" agreement.

The approval was shouted through after some members of the wage policy committee had started to file out of the room in the belief a recess had been called.

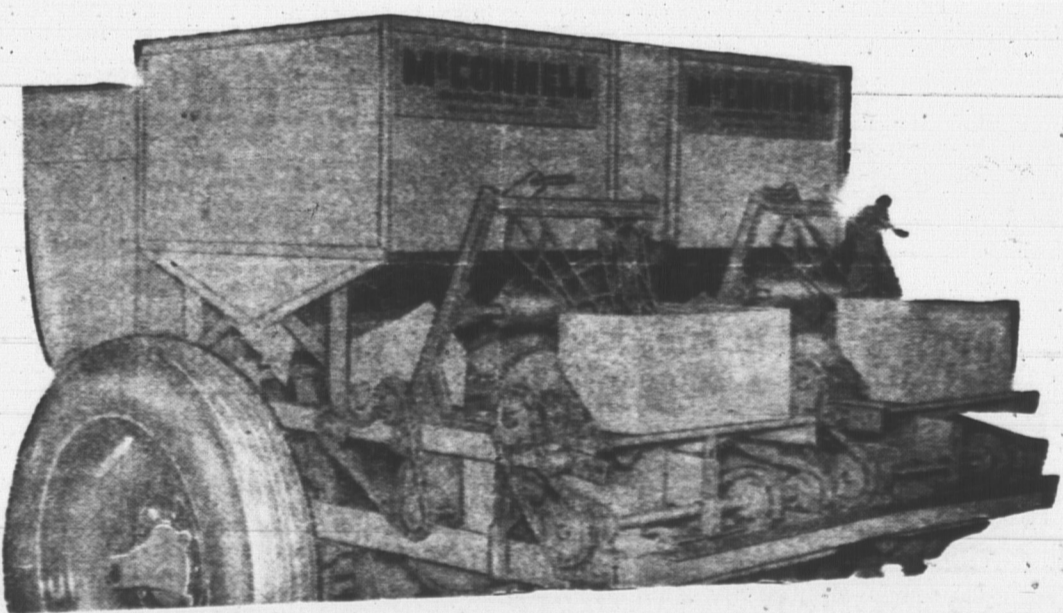

## McCONNELL SEED-CUTTING POTATO PLANTER

## Election Date Is Speculative, Pearson Says

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson describes as speculative a statement by Premier Ross Thatcher of Saskatchewan that a federal general election will be held in July or October this year.

Opposition Leader Diefenbaker asked Mr. Pearson in the Commons about Mr. Thatcher's remark, saying the Saskatchewan premier is one of the federal Liberal leader's chief lieutenants.

"I get advice on this subject from all quarters these days," Mr. Pearson added.

When Mr. Diefenbaker insisted it was a categorical statement by Mr. Thatcher, Mr. Pearson said: "It may be categorical to him, but it was speculative to me."

Then Mr. Pearson said with a grin that as a matter of course, "I would not make a decision of this kind without consulting my right honorable

friend (Mr. Diefenbaker)." The Liberal members laughed at the statement.

"Once this government starts doing that, it is going to do a far better job than it has done," Mr. Diefenbaker said.

THIRTEEN KILLED

TOKYO (AP)—Thirteen holiday hikers, mostly students, were killed in the Japanese Alps in central Japan during the weekend, police reported Sunday. Seven students and office employees in one party were found dead in Yokoo valley in

the northern Alps. They had been reported missing after an avalanche Friday. Six other persons, including two women, fell to their deaths in accidents in the central and southern sectors of the Alps.
