

by each of said members, and shall contain a summary specifying the number of shares taken from the commencement of the Company up to the said date, the total amount of calls made in each share, the total amount of calls received, the total amount of calls unpaid, the total amount of shares forfeited, and the liabilities and assets of the said Company at the said date, namely, the first Monday in January, in the year in which the said summary shall be drawn up; which register containing said list and summary shall be kept in the business office of the said Company, and shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of each and every member of the said Company, free of charge, and to every other person on the payment of one shilling; and if such inspection be refused, any officer of the Company refusing the same, and every Director of the Company knowingly permitting such refusal, shall, for every such refusal, incur a penalty not exceeding one pound, to be recovered in the Courts of Law in this Island, as in such cases is made and provided.
