

Direct Mite Wins Both Dashes Of Fast Class; My Darling In Upset Win

Lorna Letcher's Direct Mite, the only double dash winner of the meet, won both dashes of the fast class at the Charlottetown Driving Park races Saturday night. The Letcher reined gelding paced the first mile in 2:11 and then came back to do the second mile in 2:10 1-8.

Other winners on the card were Lady Abner, Belle Budlong, Rajah Hanover, Royal Scott Jr., Whispering Hope and My Darling. The meet was witnessed by a small crowd of fans.

My Darling, driven by James MacGregor, came through with an upset win as he paced his way to an easy victory in the seventh dash. MacGregor took the Senator Barbour owned mare under the wire two lengths in front of the second place Miss Knox.

A two dollar win ticket on My Darling brought a \$37.40 return.

Direct Mite pulled up from second place at the quarter pole in both the fourth and eighth races to go out front and stay on top to win the two dashes.

June Bee challenged in the fourth dash but fell short by a quarter of a length at the wire. Gahagan was a close second in the final dash.

Lady Abner finished strong on the home stretch to win the first dash of the meet over Belle Budlong. The race was marred by an accident on the upper turn involving June Bee, Captain Missour and Sister Verna. None of the three horses finished the race and were drawn from the next dash.

Belle Budlong won the second dash of this event with three

quarter lengths to spare over Lady Abner.

Rajah Hanover led from wire to wire in winning the second dash while Royal Scott Junior came up from fourth position at the three-quarter pole to lead the field home in the sixth race.

Cyril Smith drove Whispering Hope to a well deserved win in the third dash with Colonel Hansford finishing second and Rosalie H. third.

In the next meeting of these horses My Darling went to top at three-eighths pole and opened up a gap of two lengths which the other horses weren't able to close.

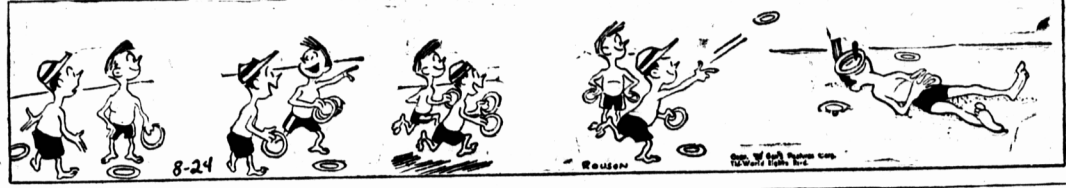
Softball Games This Evening

The Bangor softball team defeated the Charlottetown Braves 7-5 yesterday afternoon in an exhibition softball game at Bangor.

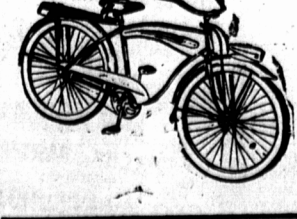
