## 1988 Seminar

Applications for the 1988 WUSC International Seminar to Mali are now available on university and college campuses across Canada.

Thirty students will be selected to participate in the summer programme which will begin in mid-June 1988 with an orientation in Ottawa and continue to Mali for approximately six weeks of travel and study that will provide a first-hand introduction to various aspects of international development.

The working language of the seminar to Mali will be French, and selected students must prepare written reports on their study area in French.

Students will be required to raise a portion of programme costs, with the remainder provided by CIDA and WUSC to cover travel, lodging, meals and all seminar activities including a pre-departure briefing in Ottawa and on orientation in Mali upon arrival.
