The surface of the pond was completely covered by leaves and beautiful lily blooms in 1920. The sorts planted at Charlottetown were hardy-day-bloomers which usually open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. throughout the summer from June to October. Some years ago we counted blooms in representative areas of the pond and estimated that there were 4000 blooms in the pond that day.
