South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:  
South West North East  
1 ♠ Pass 1 ♠ Pass  
1NT Pass 3NT  
Opening lead—five of spades.

In a great many contracts declarer has to contend with the problem of keeping on a particular opponent out of the lead.

This situation may arise in either suit or notrump play, but it is especially characteristic of notrump contracts where one defender is already known to have a long, established suit.

An unusual example of how a declarer can go in applying protective measures is offered in this hand. South forced two spade leads but was ducked to win the third.

He had first to choose whether it was better to try to establish the long club suit or the diamond suit. Since the club suit was

stronger and offered a better chance to make the contract, he led a heart to the jack and returned a club from dummy.

When East played low, South, mindful of the danger of permitting West to take the lead, played the queen, rejecting the possibility of taking a double finesse.

The first step having been successful, South played a heart to the ace and returned another club from dummy.

East played the nine whereupon South took the ace and returned a club. East had to win the trick and declarer now had nine tricks to show for his efforts.

The contract was a lucky one to make, but the way the defenders' cards were distributed it could not be defeated with the best play by each side.

It might appear that East could have stopped three notrump by playing his king of clubs either the first or second time the suit was led in order to make West's jack an entry card. But declarer has a counterstroke available if East attempts either play.

Suppose, on the first club lead, East plays the king. South simply lets him hold the trick and makes the contract. Or if East waits until the second club lead to produce the king, declarer makes the same play to get the same result. South merely adjusts his play to East's.
