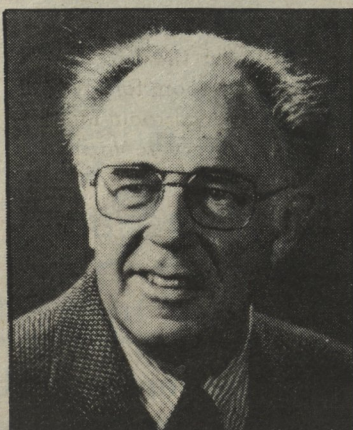
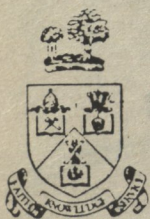
Congradulations
