### Hallowe'en Night Said Very Quiet

A little bit of soap on some downtown store windows and three small broken windows characterized Hallowe'en, 1964, in the City of Charlottetown and Police Chief Sterns Webster gave his praise.

In a statement last night the chief said "I would like to thank everybody, especially the young kids and teenagers for their cooperation in keeping things quiet Hallowe'en night."

"They damaged nothing" was the chief's words in describing Hallowe'en activities in the city. "I certainly do appreciate their efforts. I never saw the like of it."

A similar report of a quiet night came from the RCMP detachment in Charlottetown who patrolled the country areas on three small broken windows and a fire or two was set on highways but there were no reports of anything out of the ordinary.

A number of road and highway warning signs were seen down in several areas in the province but other than these, which are normal activities for Halloween, nothing serious developed.

RCMP said the cold weather helped the situation, keeping many indoors.

## Blueberry Industry Suggested For Tignish

TIGNISH — A Resources Development study group meeting was held in the Tignish Dalton School Thursday evening. Gordon Ripley, the chairman of the group, chaired the meeting in the absence of Edward McAluff.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the secretary Mrs. Reg. Eldershaw.

Mr. Ripley spoke on the resources development meeting held in Miscouche that had pressed for a study of the area. He reported as saying "in regards to a rink Mr. Ripley could give assistance for such a project and also suggested it be a community project."

Under the framework of ARDA Mr. Ripley said this could become a major industry for the people in this part of the province. There is plenty of vacant blueberry land that is just waiting to be developed, and he advised the group to take immediate action.

In regard to developing this industry the meeting was very much in favor, but they thought many questions lacked an answer at the meeting.

Speaking briefly at the meeting were Gerald Handrahan, manager of Tignish Co-operative and Rev. Arthur Pendergast of Palmer Road parish. A follow up meeting was set for Nov. 10 at 8 p.m.

Reid Sangster, provincial director of marketing will attend the meeting and answer questions on the government's stand on setting up such an industry here. Land covers interested in the appointment of this new undertaking and anxious to put vacant land to use will be urged to attend so action can be taken immediately.

## Consultation Is Scheduled For Indians

OTTAWA (CP) — Citizenship Minister Tremblay said Friday the federal government and the provinces have decided on a two-stage method for consulting Canada's 205,000 Indians about extending to them provincial welfare, education and community development services.

Following a two-day meeting with provincial ministers, Mr. Tremblay said the first step will be to consult Indians on a provincial or regional basis through Indian advisory committees. In some areas these are already established but elsewhere they will have to be set up.

The second stage will be consultation with each Indian band to determine whether they want to receive provincial services or wish to continue receiving services from the federal government.

Mr. Tremblay told reporters provincial services will not be imposed without approval of the Indian band.

## Electoral Law In Quebec Seen Possible Pattern

MONTREAL (CP) — Quebec's electoral law, unique in Canada for its stringent restrictions on campaign spending, will be given a solid once-over by the federal government's committee on limiting election expenses.

Francis Robert, a Trois-Rivières, Que., lawyer named to head the five-member committee said Wednesday the legislation will be studied by the committee.

"Obviously we will study the law because of the preliminary work which has already gone into it," he told a reporter.

But, he emphasized, electoral laws of nations where parliamentary government exists will also be studied.

Mr. Robert, 46, was in Montreal to attend a meeting of the Canadian National Railways board of directors, his first since his appointment to the board Oct. 15.

Under the Quebec Election Act which took effect Jan. 1, party expenses are limited to a maximum of 25 cents per voter in the province.

Candidates, too, are limited in expenses. The amounts vary between 40 cents and 60 cents per voter depending on the number of voters in the riding.
