# Brazilian Banks, Exchanges Show Signs Of Confidence

**RIO DE JANEIRO (AP)**—Brazilian banks and stock exchanges reopened with a flurry of activity Monday amid signs of renewed confidence in the country's economy after last week's military-political revolt that overthrew leftist president Joao Goulart.

Goulart's currency, the Cruzeiro, which in relation to U.S. currency fell to 2,000 cruzeiros for \$1 from 300 for \$1 during Goulart's 2 1/2 years in office, rallied sharply on the open money market in Rio de Janeiro. Monday's quotations were 1,300 cruzeiros to \$1. The cruzeiro was traded for the first time since banks and exchange closed last week's revolt.

The value of the Brazilian cruzeiro in relation to the U.S. dollar is one way of measuring confidence in Brazil's economic and financial situation. Many feared Brazil was entering financial talsipin in Goulart's final days in office.

600 Goulart's Brazilian Labor party claim Castello Branco is barred by the constitution from assuming the presidency because he was still in active military service at the time Goulart's office became vacant. The constitution says that a military man can serve as president only if he leaves active duty 90 days before the vacancy occurs.

But 9,000 troops with armored units moved into Brasilia, the country's capital, Saturday and this could be enough to convince Congressmen that they should act quickly in establishing the interim government.

The National Democratic Union, the Conservative minority, is expected to push for Castello Branco, presumably if it finds some constitutional loophole in an attempt to win the presidency.

The U.S. renewed its offer of financial help after Goulart's ouster.
