Thefts and Safety

A NEW YEAR HAS STARTED AT THE UNIVERSITY AND I AM TAKING THIS OPPORTUNITY TO OUTLINE A FEW CRIME PREVENTION AND SAFETY TIPS.

THEFT OF PERSONAL AND UNIVERSITY PROPERTY IS A MATTER THAT SHOULD CONCERN EVERYONE IN THE UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY. PREVENTION CAN BE FOUND IN SIMPLE DAILY RULES OF CONDUCT AND I HAVE PUT TOGETHER SOME RULES EVERYONE CAN FOLLOW:

1. Always lock your office if you are leaving it unattended, even for a short time.
2. Place small articles in locked drawers or locked cabinets overnight.
3. Lock all cabinets and desk drawers and windows at the end of the day.
4. Keep pocketbooks and wallets, etc. on your person or in a safe place, **not** on or under your desk or table.
5. Never leave money or valuables in clothing hung in clothes closets or racks or in study carrels.
6. Bolt typewriters and office machines, etc. to your desk or table where practicable. This work can be carried out by the maintenance service department.
7. Work out procedures with your co-workers and fellow-students that will ensure reasonable protection to personal and University property.
8. Report defective locks and door closers and window catches, etc. to the maintenance service for prompt repair.
9. Be alert for loiterers and persons acting suspiciously by asking them their business and, if the assistance of a Security Officer is required, call the Security Office at 566-0373 or 566-0384 or 566-0600.
10. Immediately report all losses or thefts to the Security Office at one of the above numbers or come directly to the Security Office in person.
