Western oils took the heaviest index loss, dip of almost three-quarters of a point. Base metals were about even with the previous close.

Hudson Bay added a point among senior base metals but Noranda lost 1/4 and International Nickel 1/8. The higher-priced copper stocks, Gold and White Opemiska gained a same amount.

Coldstream closed with a 20-cent gain at a 1936 high of \$3.80 in heavy trading among coppers. Temagami, however, lost 25 cents.

Belcher was up 30 cents in junior base metals. Other winners were Nipissing and Little Long Lac. Kirkland Hudson lost 20 cents.

Uranium was firm with Northspan ahead 25 cents and Gulch up 12 cents. Gunnar lost 1/4. Bulolo advanced 35 cents in golds and Beattie-Duquesne 20 cents. Dome Mines lost 1/4.
