Crime Increase Is Reported

TORONTO (CP)—J. L. Edwards, director of the centre of criminology at the University of Toronto, said here it is no longer true to say crime does not pay.

He said 1963 figures showed that in Toronto a person committing robbery stands a 50-50 chance of not being apprehended and that rates of imprisonment are even higher in Calgary and Vancouver.

Prof. Edwards was addressing about 50 delegates from across Canada — including the attorneys general of Ontario and Newfoundland and representatives of the other provinces and the federal government — at the first national conference on the prevention of crime.

Apart from Prof. Edwards' introductory speech, sessions of the four-day conference will be private.

He said the number of Criminal Code offences known to police had risen 32 per cent between 1961 and 1963 compared with a four-per-cent increase in population.
