Panther varsity coach Jack Hynes also released Tony yesterday because, as he said, "He was too big to be stickboy."

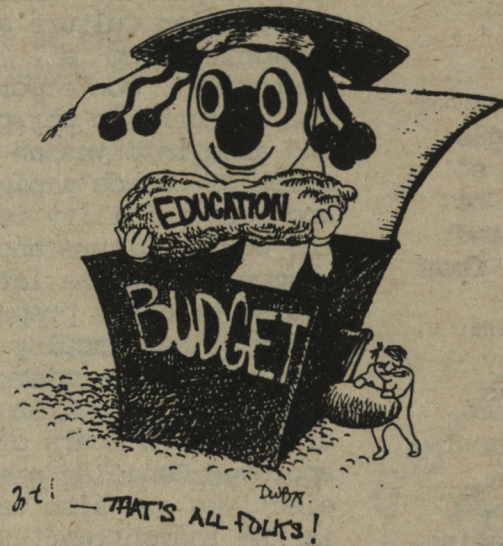
Rumour also has it that the owner of G.J.'s has ordered an ironing board which could possibly separate Tony and Bev at Jims.
