Increase In Bus Tours To Province Scheduled

J. Frank Pellerin, manager of the Charlottetown Hotel, Friday said that 70 organized P.E.I. bus tours are all planned for this summer and that several other bookings are expected before the peak of the tourist season arrives.

In connection with future conventions at the Charlottetown, Mr. Pellerin said that only three are slated for this summer so far, but 1964 will definitely see all previous records in this field, the reason being the coming of the Island's Centennial year.

"We expect the number of bus tours to visit our hotel to increase this year over last year's 47 tours," said Mr. Pellerin, "and several bookings have been made for 1964 and even one from North Carolina. It is set for 65.

With the vehicles averaging 34 persons per trip, it is estimated that at least 2,500 persons will visit the island by way of

Packing Plant Staff X-rayed

The entire staff of the Charlottetown branch of Canada Packers was x-rayed recently by the mobile unit of the P.E.I. Tuberculosis League.

The league's x-ray equipment was taken from its van and set up in the packing plant and employees were x-rayed at the rate of about one a minute.

League president, H.T. Holman, said the project was in line with tuberculosis preventive measures conducted throughout Canada and special stress has been placed on the mass chest x-raying of food handlers throughout the province during the past two years.

He said that during the past two years employees of the fish processing plant in Souris and the dairies and Jenkin cannery in Summerside, as well as personnel of restaurants in Charlottetown had been x-rayed. The City committee advised it through the facilities of the league and the provincial department of health.

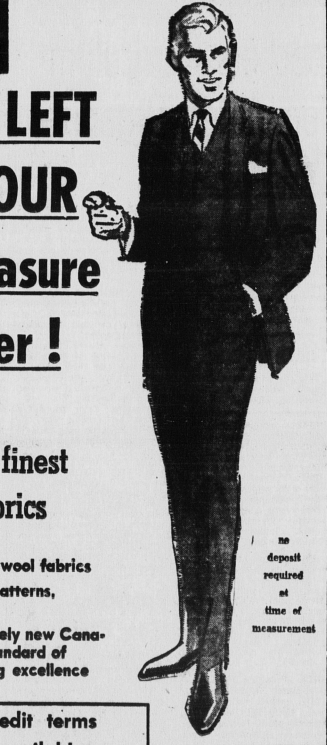
