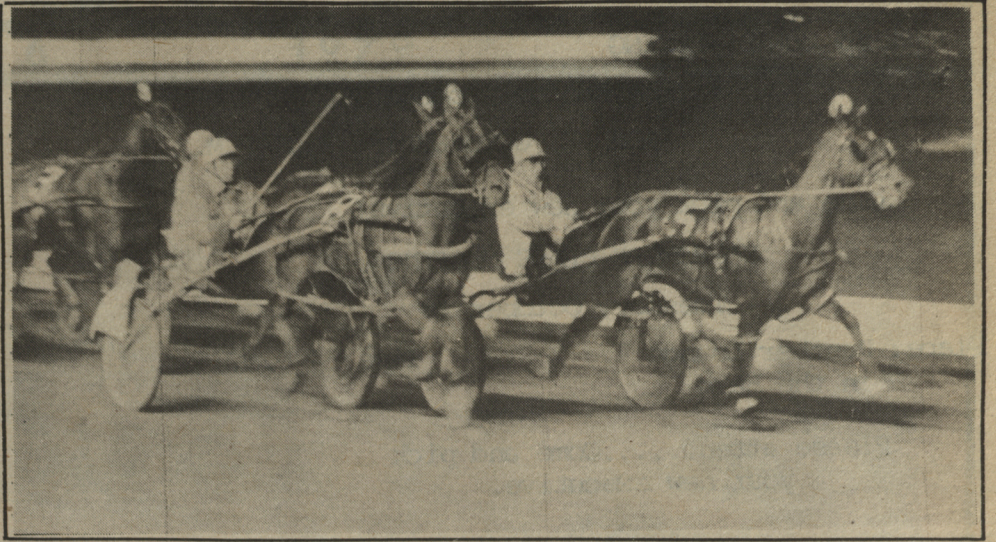


HARNESS RACING, COMING UP

P.E.I. HARNESS DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIP

The fourth annual P.E.I. Intercollegiate Harness Driving Championship for university students will be staged at Charlottetown Driving Park on Thursday night, October 11 between 4th and 5th dash.



Last year, 20-year-old Kinkora native Kevin McCarville, from University of Prince Edward Island won the P.E.I. racing crown and went on to win the Canadian Championship. Six U.P.E.I. students will be driving for provincial crown, and the winner of Thursday night's race will compete in the National final at Mohawk Raceway, Ontario, for \$2,000 in scholarships provided by the Canadian Trotting Association. They will also be trying for National Association of Canadian Race Track's Trophy, which U.P.E.I. has won twice in the last three years.
