Strange Stone Carvings Found

VICTORIA (CP)—Strange Stone carvings found on islands in the Gulf of Georgia raised the possibility Tuesday that a unique civilization existed there 2,500 years ago.

Wilson Duff, provincial museum anthropologist, reported Monday on the artifacts, following a survey of the islands in the gulf between Vancouver Island and lower British Columbia mainland.

The stones, largest of which measured two inches, were found on north and south Pender Islands by residents here.

Mr. Duff said he thinks the carvings are mementoes of a culture differing from that of prehistoric Indians.

His reasoning is based on the fact the present artifacts are the only ones of their kind ever found. If the carvings were left by an early Indian race, the art would have been handed down and more
