

Commonwealth Mining Men See Canadian Asbestos Mines

ASBESTOS, Que. (CP) — The world's chief source of asbestos was displayed Thursday to the Commonwealth Mining and Metallurgical congress.

Added to the many other dramatic mining operations which they have seen across Canada, delegates saw here in Quebec's Eastern Townships the mines which produce some 75 per cent of the free world's supply of the miracle fire-resistant material.

The operations are at 12 producing mines located in a rectangle some 50 miles long and 15 miles wide.

SEE OPEN PIT

On the spectacular side, delegates here saw the famous Jeffrey open pit mine of Johns-Manville, Co. Ltd., a gaping hole in the earth some 450 feet deep and, from rim to rim, reaching almost a mile across in any direction.

Asbestos — the laymen in the group learned — is a mineral in fibre form.

It is found in rock, technically known as a serpentine of hydrous magnesium silicate.

Mining asbestos is a matter of

digging out rock and asbestos fibre formation.

Milling them is a matter of separating them. Chiefly this is done with air in a process which requires circulation of 2,500,000 cubic feet of air a minute.

DUST IS ENEMY

Once the air has accomplished about 80 per cent of the separation, the rest is a continual sifting process which takes out the remaining rock materials and separates the asbestos into grades of long and short fibres.

Traditional enemy in the process — now largely conquered in modern plants — is dust.

In the Johns-Manville plant, for instance, 600,000 cubic feet of the 2,500,000 cubic feet of air circulated a minute, is for dust control. Other dust-control features include cloth bags with a total surface area of 30 acres; four miles of dust-control piping; and 12 miles of control wiring.

Asbestos — starting out essentially as a fire and heat-resistant material — has expanded into many products.

One of its most daily uses for the average person is the brake lining of his cars' brakes—but it is found also in long list of products including asbestos paper, shingles, paper for roofing and lining, pipe coverings, pipes and

Y's Men Hear Talk On Water Safety Program
