FOG SIGNAL AT CAPE ELIZABETH.

THE United States Government has given Notice, that a steam fog whistle has recently been erected on Cape Elizabeth, western side of entrance to Portland harbour, 267 yards to the southward of the light-house, from which, during thick and foggy weather and snow storms, the whistle will be sounded for *eight second*, once in *each minute*.

FOG SIGNAL AT CAPE ANN.

Also, that a fog signal has been established at Cape Ann (Thatcher Island) light station, near the southern tower.

It consists of a trumpet, blown by an engine, and gives a blast of *seven seconds'* duration, at intervals of *forty-three seconds*.

The trumpet turns from the direction of the Salvages on the north-east round to the vicinity of Eastern point, and will be heard more distinctly between these points than elsewhere.
