Industrial Development Bank Reports

OTTAWA (CP) - The Industrial Development Bank reported Wednesday its loans, investments and guarantees outstanding on June 30 amounted to \$250,291,159, 16 per cent higher than at the end of June last year.

The bank approved 648 loans amounting to \$29,433,000 in the three months ending June 30, which was the third quarter of the Crown-owned bank's current fiscal year.

The amount was 13 per cent higher than loans approved in the third quarter of the banks previous fiscal year.

The bank had 6,746 customers on its books this year, an increase of 18 per cent over last year.

The bank, established in 1944, helps small and medium-size businesses to obtain financing not available from other sources.
