CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You have the following hand, both sides vulnerable:
AKQ7 ♥ 8 ♠ Q5 ♣ J42
1. You are the dealer. What do you bid?
2. Your partner deals a n d bids One Diamond, next player passes. What do you bid?
3. Your left-hand opponent bids One Diamond, your partner passes, and your right-hand opponent bids One Heart. What do you bid?
4. Your partner deals a n d bids One Heart, the next player passes, and your partner bids Three Diamonds. What do you bid?
5. Your partner deals a n d bids One Club, your partner passes, and the next player bids One Spade. What do you bid?
6. One club. Despite the 16 points and notrump distribution, which would suggest opening with a notrump, a suit bid is better with this hand. As usual, white clubs and spades of lower suit in order to save bidding space. The notrump bid is better because there are two unguarded suits.
7. One spade. Of course, game is nice, but that doesn't mean you have to jump the bid to show it. A jump - shift to two spades would show a probable slam, and this hand isn't quite good enough for that. Change one of the hearts into a spade or a diamond and you would then have a proper two spade bid. The response of one spade is 100 per cent forcing.
8. Double. This indicates values for an opening bid and support for the unmentioned suits. It would be wrong to bid a s p a c e. That would show greater spade length and componently less in hearts.
9. Redouble. This indicates 10 or more points. We intend to go to game eventually. It is a double the opponents for penalties.
10. Four clubs. A small slam is already certain, since partner's jump-shift shows at least 20 points - distributional or 7 otherwise. The real goal is a grand slam. Four clubs is simply a waiting bid to force partner to reveal the basis for his jump shift. Thus, partner may have:
AK865 ♥ AKQ72 ♠ AK83 ♣ or other similar holdings.
We'll have to wait and see what partner has to go on.
11. Pass. The value of a hand changes as the bidding progresses. With the opponents bidding clubs and spades, our hand has dropped in value effectively. Before the bidding started, we had some hope that partner would have length in 13's e suits. This hope has been largely dissipated. Our best chance now is to assume a defensive posture and hope the opponents get too high.
