ESAGE REVEALS PLANS

Quebec Fiscal Formula Would Enrich Province

 QUEBEC (CP) — Premier Jean Lesage said Thursday the formula he plans to submit to the federal-provincial fiscal conference in Ottawa next week would enrich the Quebec Treasury by some \$150,000,000 a year.

He said at a press conference the formula applied to \$110 million of provincial income tax, \$500,000,000 annually to the provinces from federal taxes and direct taxation powers and changing the system of equalization payments.

His formula contained basically the same proposals made at the 1960 fiscal conference but qualified the changes suggested in more specific terms.

Premier Lesage will ask for 25 per cent (now 17 per cent) of personal income taxes, 25 per cent (now nine per cent) of corporation income taxes and 100 per cent (now 30 per cent) of succession duties.

Under the proposal in the 1963-64 fiscal year would increase Quebec's revenue by \$150,000,000 to roughly \$278,800,000. It would cost Ottawa about \$300,000,000 to apportion to 10 provinces.
