The properties purchased include the former MacNeill Motors showroom and garage, a vacant lot and two warehouses to the rear owned by R. A. Horne, the E. H. Strong building and a paved parking lot owned by Allie MacNeill.

New Dragger Joins Fleet

HALIFAX — (CP) — Capt. Jonas Bjornsson, 60, an Icelandic fisherman who put to sea 40 years ago, sailed for his home port of Souris, P.E.I. Tuesday. His new \$70,000 dragger the Iceland was fit and trim after minor repairs to radar and depth sounding equipment.

Capt. Bjornsson netted 170,000 pounds of fish last year while skipper of the Souris-III. He hopes to surpass this mark with his new craft, launched at Port Greville, N.S. June 16.

The 65-foot dragger, one of the largest in the Island fleet, will operate in Northumberland Strait most of the summer.
