### C.N.R. To Stop Ch'town - Moncton Sleeper Service

MONCTON.—Lack of patronage resulting in an annual \$15,000 deficit on the operation is impelling the CNR to discontinue sleeping car service between Moncton and Charlottetown, P.E.I. It was announced in Moncton Wednesday.  
 George Stiven, general passenger agent for the company's Atlantic Region, said the sleeper on the daily train in each direction will be removed when time table changes for the fall and winter become effective later this month.  
 Mr. Stiven said the sleeper, able to carry 32 passengers has a daily average revenue occupancy rate of only three and half. On a percentage basis, the sleeping car is 90 per cent unused.  
 J.H. Easton, assistant transport economist, said revenue and operational cost records establish that the sleeping car service is

losing approximately \$15,000 yearly. Total revenue is about \$5,000, against expenditures of \$20,500.  
 The CNR's train between Moncton and Charlottetown, which operates in daytime service in both directions, connects at Moncton with the Ocean Limited and will continue to do so, Mr. Stiven added.  
 Island passengers can continue to reserve accommodations for sleeping car space from Moncton and back again through local CNR passenger agents on Prince Edward Island, Mr. Stiven said.  
 Final trip of the through sleeping car to Charlottetown will leave Montreal Oct. 24, arriving Oct. 25.  
 Its counterpart in the opposite direction will leave Charlottetown for Montreal on Monday, Oct. 27.

### Youth Pleads Guilty To Two Charges

A Hunter River youth, appearing in Magistrate's Court yesterday morning on two separate charges, was remanded one week for sentence.  
 Appearing before Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, the youth pleaded guilty to "joyriding"—taking a motor vehicle with intent to drive without the owner's consent—and willful destruction of property.  
 Eight trucks also appeared before Magistrate Gaudet on charges of operating a motor vehicle without due care and consideration for other persons on the highway. All were fined \$10 and costs or 10 days when they pleaded guilty as charged.  
 Included among the violators were two residents of Moncton and one from Harrington, Vernon River, Wood Islands, Murray River, Glen Martin and Douglas Street in Charlottetown.  
 A Hunter River man was fined

\$20 and costs or 30 days when he pleaded guilty to having in his possession intoxicating liquor in a place other than his residence.  
 A similar fine was handed a Kensington man on a charge of having possession of liquor not purchased on his individual permit.  
 Several cases were adjourned. A Hunter River resident, a mill owner, charged with allowing sawdust to escape in waters frequented to trout, registered a plea of not guilty. The case was adjourned to Wednesday, October 15th.  
 A Tignish man charged with driving while intoxicated had his case further adjourned to October 15th, with bail to stand.  
 A Grand Tracadie man charged with driving while his licence to do so was suspended was remanded for one week.  
 A Montague man was sentenced to seven days in the Queen's County Jail when he pleaded guilty to carrying on his person a concealed weapon other than a gun.  
 Speeding fines of \$10 and costs were given residents of Mount Albion and North River. A Victoria woman was reprimanded when she pleaded guilty to a charge of leaving her car unattended on the travel portion of the highway.

#### FEATHER BUNS

Combine ½ c. water, 3 tbs. granulated sugar, 1 tsp. salt and ¼ c. shortening; heat, stirring constantly, until sugar and salt are dissolved and shortening melted; cool to lukewarm. Meantime, measure into a large bowl ½ c. lukewarm water; crumble and add 1 cake Best Yeast—or stir in 1 tsp. granulated sugar and sprinkle with 1 envelope Best dry Yeast. Let stand 10 minutes, THEN stir well. Add cooled sugar-shortening mixture and stir in 1 well-beaten egg and 1 tsp. lemon juice. Sift together twice 2 c. once-sifted all-purpose flour and ¼ tsp. ground mace. Stir into yeast mixture; beat until smooth. Work in 1 c. once-sifted all-purpose flour to make a very soft dough. Grease top of dough. Cover; set in warm place, free from draft. Let rise until doubled in bulk. Punch down dough; cut out rounded spoonfuls of dough with a table-spoon; drop into greased muffin pans, filling each pan about half-full. Grease tops. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Bake in a hot oven, 425°, about 20 minutes. Yield—20 medium-sized buns.
