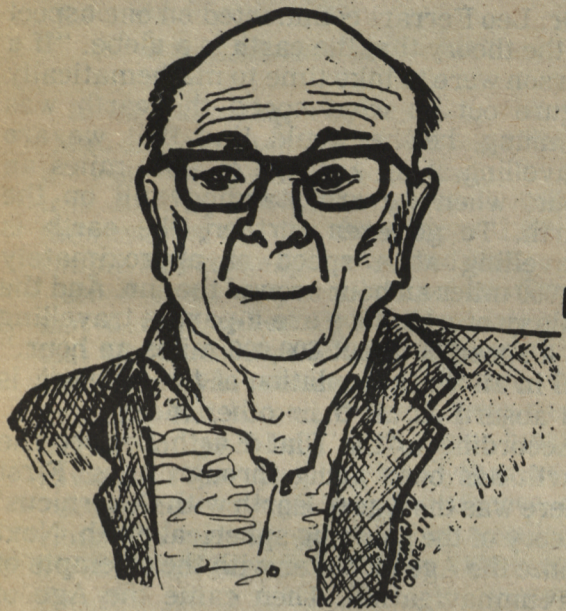


# Disappointing weekend for panthers
