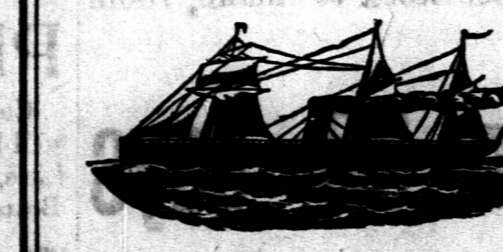

THE COLUMBIA WON THE SECOND RACE

Outsailing the Shamrock Around the Thirty Mile Triangular Course.

SHAMROCK LED AROUND TWO TURNING BUOYS.

A Twenty Mile Northwest Wind and Smooth Sea—Time of Start, Turning and Finish—How They Sailed—Third Race Takes Place Today and if Columbia Wins She Will Retain the Cup.
