

Quebec Said Not Province Like Others

TORONTO (CP)—Quebec has a special place in Confederation and is not and cannot be a province like the others, Trade Minister Sharp said Thursday.

For historical reasons Quebec has a special responsibility for the preservation and nurturing of the peculiar heritage of 'FransCanada,' he said in an address prepared for delivery to the Empire Club.

The speech was read to the club by its president, R. H. Hillborn, after Mr. Sharp's plane was unable to leave Ottawa because of fog.

Because of its unique position, Quebec could be expected

to be more zealous of its rights under the Canadian constitution than the other provinces, the speech said. And because it did so was no reason to fear the country was breaking up.

HAS ONE OBJECTIVE The Canada pension plan was an example of federal-provincial governments working together towards a Canadian objective. A federal plan was the logical way to achieve uniformity and portability, but Quebec insisted its own plan be adopted.

"Yet by concurrent legislation in similar form in Quebec and the federal level, there can and, I am confident, there will be, a uniform and portable Canadian pension plan in operation."

There couldn't be a neat and tidy division between the federal and provincial authorities for all time. This was becoming apparent in the fields of taxation and in his own department of trade.

Since Confederation, there had been numerous changes in federal-provincial relations. Changes in these relations could be achieved without danger to Canadian unity as had others in the past, provided there was a will to do so.
