

Started As 'War' Measure, Income Tax Still With Us

On a soft afternoon in 1917, Sir Thomas White, finance minister in the Borden Conservative government, told the Commons about the drawbacks of a tax assessed against the personal income of Canadians.

Despite the fact that the First World War had wrrenched the country out of a depression, incomes hadn't increased materially. He said in many cases they had declined because of a soaring cost of living.

Opening lead—two of clubs. Card play is not an exact science. A great many plays are based on probabilities, not certainties, and some of these play rests on assumptions which ultimately prove to be false.

Nevertheless, good card play is a logical process, not a haphazard one. Sound reasoning does not produce victory in every case, but it is bound to return excellent dividends in the long run.
