War in The Transvaal

Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.

CARDINAL VAUGHAN AND THE Text of the Loyal Mandement of the Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster Concerning the War in South Africa.

His Eminence Cardinal Vaughan has issued the following circular to his clergy:
 Archbishop's House Westminster, December 20, 1899.—
 Rev. Dear Father.—The fortune of war in South Africa fills the public mind with justifiable anxiety.
 While the negotiations were proceeding public prayers pro pace were offered throughout the diocese at every mass when the rubric permitted. Since the declaration of war prayers have been offered in like manner pro tempore belli. These prayers continue.

A solemn requiem was sung last month at the Pro-Cathedral for the souls of those who had fallen in battle. A second public requiem will be sung at the Oratory on the first day available. Functions in other churches will be duly announced.

In addition to prayers for dead, we should now offer public and united supplication for our army, officers and men, and for speedy success to the British arms.

Whatever doubt was entertained as to the lawfulness of enforcing the British demands by resource to the sword, there can be no doubt now that we have been forced into war, and that justice is in our side.

It has been clearly ascertained that Boer leaders in both republics had long since determined to strike for the establishment of a Boer supremacy throughout South Africa; that military preparations on a large scale had been secretly carried out for that purpose. It is also clear that the negotiations for a peaceable solution of the difficulties that had arisen were suddenly broken off by the ultimatum declaring war within a few hours, unless England withdrew her soldiers from her own colony, and forbade her troopships to enter her own African ports. There can be no mistake as to the intention; the invasion of British territory has been accompanied by a formal and repeated declaration of the annexation of the invaded territory to the Boer Republic. It is always lawful and sometimes necessary to resist invasion and annexation vi et armis.

It is now a question of something more than of what is lawful. The question is, shall the British Empire be allowed to fall to pieces by supineness and by want of determination and self-denial? The answer is, No.

This Empire has been raised by the same Providence that called the Roman Empire into existence, and as God used the one towards the attainment of His own Divine purposes of mercy, so does he seem to be using the other.

In spite of the blunders and crimes committed by many of her sons in building up the Empire, the Empire has made for peace, for liberty for law and order. An Empire that has power to establish these conditions—which are preliminary to the spread of Christianity—is possessed of a great and sacred trust, not to be surrendered until God Himself shall demand the surrender. At the present moment countless millions in the Dark Continent depend for their temporal and eternal salvation upon the establishment of

While we realize with great confidence the most honorable mission with which God seems to have entrusted us, we must endeavor not to be altogether unworthy of it, and must determine to make God, both in national and private life, the first object of our love and service. And then, we must be ready personally and collectively to make every sacrifice necessary or useful for the fulfilment of His trust.

For these purposes, you will please to recite on Sundays, until further orders, after the principal Mass or at Benediction, the prayers to be found in the Manual among the "Occasional Prayers" and headed, "In Times of Calamity."

battlefields. The Daily Mail, speaking of the despatching of the old 20th Regiment to the scene of action, says: "The Lancashire Fusiliers now ordered to the front is a battalion to rejoice the heart of its commanding officer. He leads to the front eleven hundred men of over seven years' service, nearly all of whom distinguished themselves in Lyttelton's brigade before Omdurman. This, the old 20th Regiment, is in the 211th year of its existence." The 20th is a Regiment very intimately associated with Canada's history. In its time it has furnished three Governor Generals to Canada and at one time, long before the inception of fire brigades, saved Montreal from the flames. It was this regiment which after fighting all through the Peninsular War with the Duke of Wellington, had the distinguished honor of the closest connection with the great Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte at the finish of his marvelous career, being in charge of the Emperor at St. Helena during his exile there, and carrying his corpse on their shoulders to his lonely grave under the cypress trees at St. Helena. In the famous picture by Miss Thompson, of the crowded troopship sailing for the Crimean War and its picture of the return from the war, the regiment there by her brush depicted is the old 20th. The immortal Wolfe for eight years was in command of the 20th. Sir John Colborne, Governor-General of Canada, was an old 20th officer (afterwards Lord Seaton and a field marshal), and whose name will stand in the history of our country till the crack of doom.

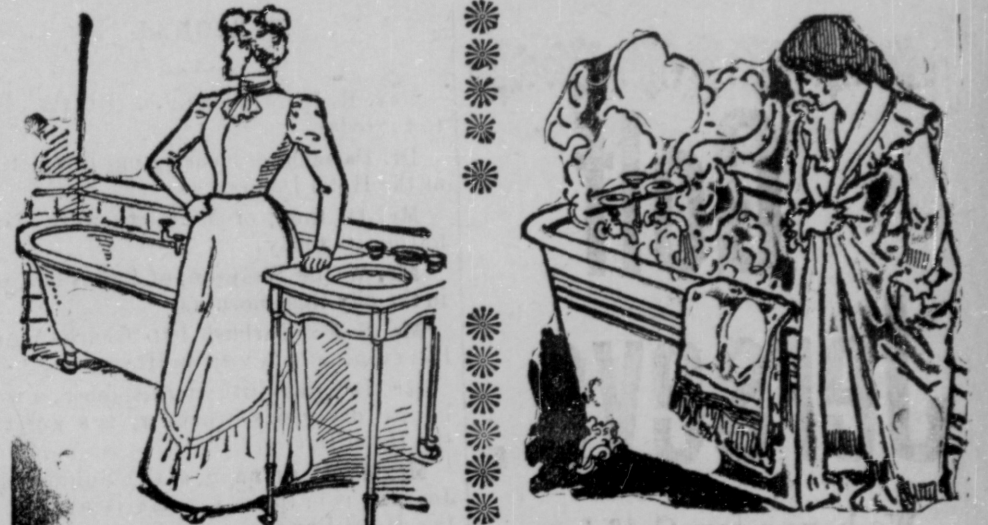
