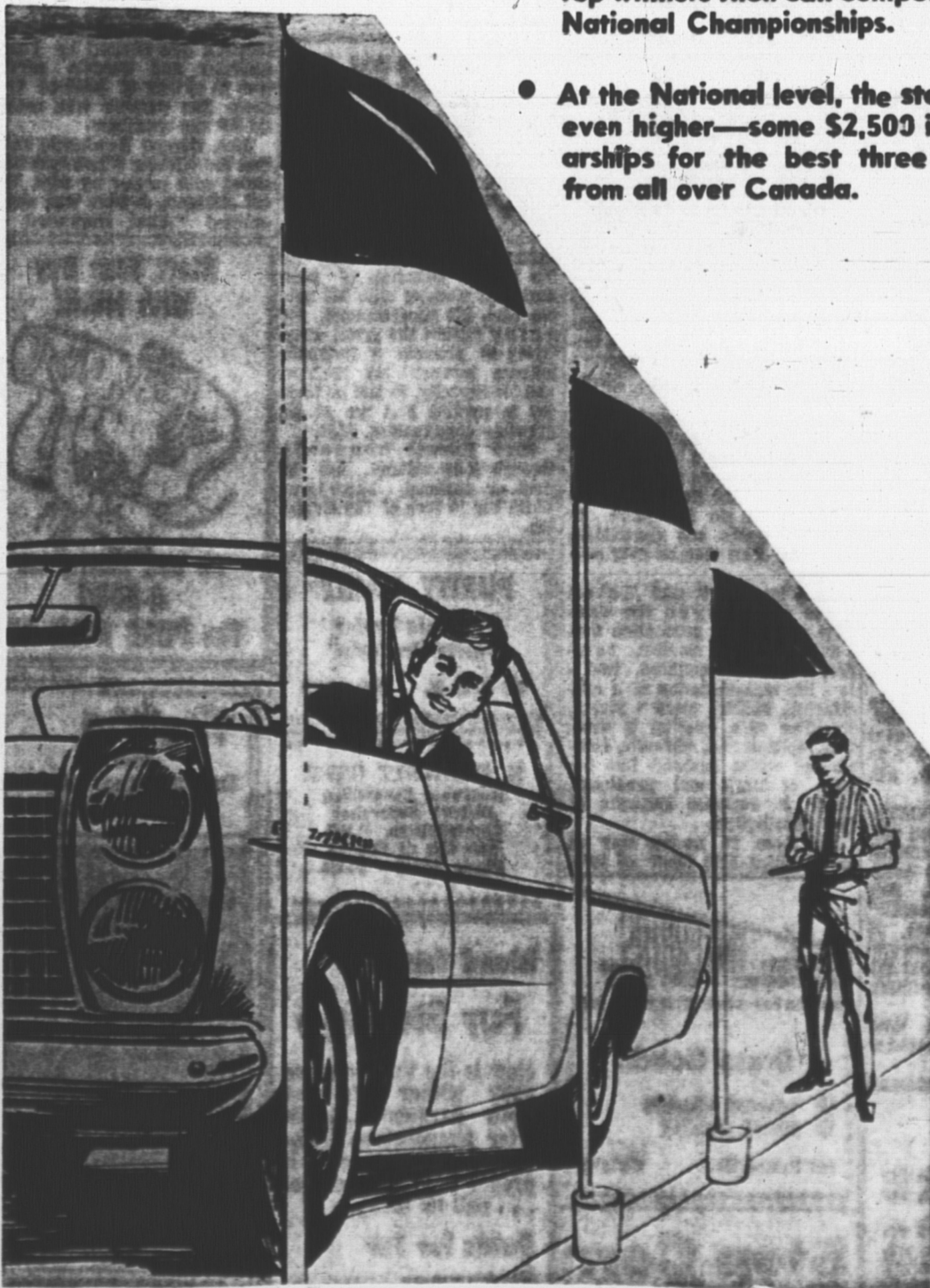
Two persons were charged with being drunk and incapable. One was fined \$5 and costs for two days and the other accused was remanded to May 21.

Shaws Plan Six Week Europe Trip

Premier W. R. Shaw and Mrs. Shaw plan to spend about six weeks in the United Kingdom this summer on vacation.

They may also visit parts of Continental Europe.

Premier and Mrs. Shaw will likely travel by ocean liner to England, leaving in August after July's federal provincial conference.

"About the only way to get a satisfactory rest from the pressures of government business is to take an ocean cruise," the premier said.

KILLS 10 AND SELF CHAVAGNEUX, FRANCE (AP) — Authorities said Thursday a workman had slain 10 of his relatives and then shot himself in this village 20 miles from Lyon in southeastern France. An official at the mayor's office said first reports identified the dead as the worker's mother, his wife, and six children, his brother and a niece.
