### Hilda Ramsay C.C.F. Candidate

Hilda Ramsay, C.C.F. Candidate for Councillor in Third Prince, is the first woman to be nominated in Prince Edward Island. She is an extremely attractive person, a fluent speaker, has a friendly personality, and a ready smile.

Mrs. Ramsay has won provincial and national recognition of her ability. Active in community work, she is a natural leader in church and neighborhood organizations and projects. She was Provincial President of the Catholic Women's League for two years, was the national study group convener for that body, and during the war she served as War Service Convener for the Island. In 1946 she was awarded the Canadian Drama Award for her work in promoting drama in the Province.

Mrs. Ramsay is prevented, because of the short campaign and the bad road conditions, from personally canvassing the most of the homes in her constituency. She is holding several public meetings, however, and is rapidly gathering support in her campaign to win a seat in the Legislature. "Governments today," she says, "are becoming increasingly concerned with social welfare, with the health and education of our children, and with the care of the aged. These are matters in which women are vitally interested. It's time our Legislature had a woman's voice to speak on these matters."
