- Aug 1958. Shaw's 'Platform Offer' Processing Plant for Animal Products
Oct. 1959. Farmers attempt to establish abattoir with Nova Scotia participation refused by government.
Aug. 1960. Farmers attempt to establish at Summerside - request not answered for 2 months - Not enough information.
Sept. 1961. Premier Shaw states cannot help farmer on abattoir, because Gov. once loaned money to potato producers and they lost it.
Mar. 1962. Gov. watched farmers abattoir co. lose money on order in Council offer of loan, but won't answer correspondence.
May 1, 1962. Special Meeting of Cabinet re abattoir for farmers.
May 3, 1962. Arranged Meeting with Gov. Cabinet - refused hearing with farmers. Door closed in their faces.
May 10, 1962. Farmers meeting Community Hall by resolution asked Gov. for answer within 10 days favorable or unfavorable. Gov. claims mail lost. Correspondence recalled.
May 3, 1962. Premier Shaw's statement re Meeting of Farmers "NOT ENOUGH INFORMATION" BU

Premier Shaw's letter of March, 1962 re abattoir quote - 'I would like to tell you that I am in possession of all the facts in connection with this whole situation.'

May 8, 1962. Mr. Andrew MacRae, Minister of Agriculture statement to Pioneer-Journal

quote - "there are a sufficient number of killing plants in the Maritime area to meet the requirements of the beef industry for the foreseeable future."

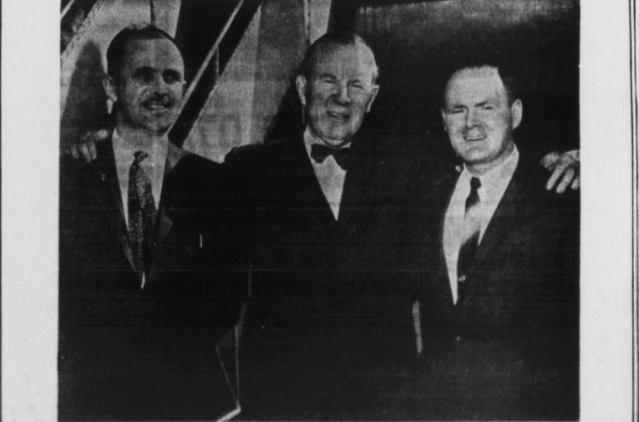
