So, getting right to the heart of financial aid for this week I ask that you check out the upcoming deadlines for bursaries, scholarships, and programs that I know about. This information is strictly for students at the undergraduate level.

Bilingualism in Education: Federal/Provincial Program: Application forms for the Official Languages Study Fellowship Program will be available from the Department of Education of phone Ron Rice at 368-4650 for information.

Canadian Armed Forces: Student Services has two files for the Armed Forces. One deals with the Regular Officer Training Program, and the other deals with their Education Assistance Loan Program. No deadline.

Canadian Association of Broadcast-

ers Scholarships: This association is affiliated with two memorial awards that defend and promotes the interests of private broadcasting, and assists stations to program stations to effectively and serve their communities successfully. Students involved in Communication courses may apply to either the Ruth Hancock or the Raymond Crepault Scholarships by May 31.

Canadian Golf Association: This national award is for applicants who best meet the criteria of being outstanding scholars and very good golfers. The application deadline is May 15.

4-H Provincial and National Awards: This organization offers three scholarships or study awards available to all 4-H's who meet the criteria. May 1 is the deadline for all three awards: Prince Edward Island 4-H Council Scholarship, The Petro-Canada 4-H Youth Award, The Canadian National Exhibition Scholarship.

Community of West Royalty/Dr. Peter Meincke Award: This award is handled by the UPEI Registrar's Office. Applicants must be graduating students who have excelled in the area of community services. The deadline is March 31.

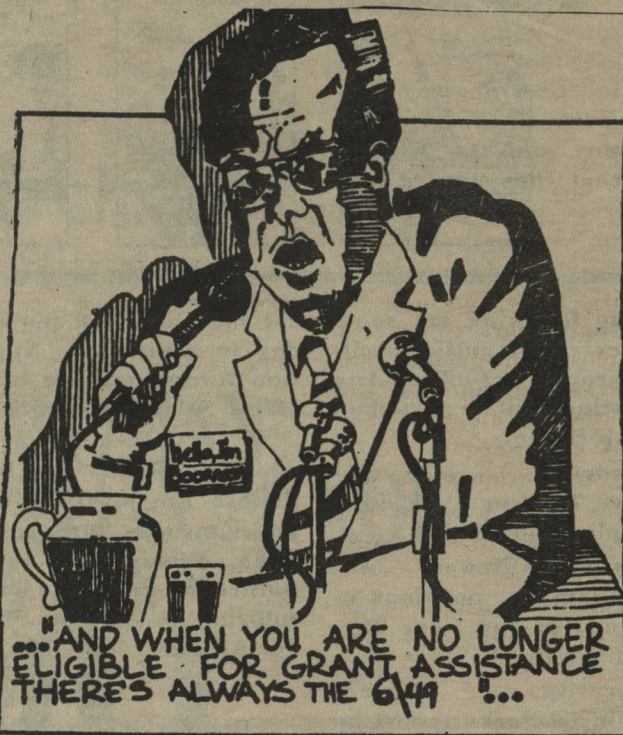
George and Nora Elwin Scholarships: (McMaster University): Five \$10,000 scholarships are offered to outstanding students from across Canada. A student from UPEI would have had to complete one year of uni-

versity with high first-class standing in order to qualify for these scholarships. Deadline for the fields of Arts, Sciences, Business, Engineering, Nursing, and Physical Education is March 31.

The Helen Herring Scholarship/The Prince Edward Island Women's Institute: The Helen Herring Scholarship of \$500. will be awarded to a student from PEI, who by September, 1987, is enrolled in at the final year of a university program leading to a degree in Home Economics. Deadline is April 30.

New Brunswick Home Economics Association Scholarships: This \$1000. award is open to residents of New Brunswick who have completed at least two years college training in Home Economics and are presently enrolled in an accredited university. Applicant must be furthering education towards a graduate or post-graduate degree in Home Economics, or taking post-graduate training which does not carry a stipend. Applications accepted prior to May 31.

The Planetary Society College Fellowship Award: Grants are awarded to students who are majoring in Engineering and Sciences. Awards are made on the basis of scholastic achievement, a commitment to a career in planetary related science, and a written essay on a relevant topic. There are five \$1000. awards with a deadline of April 15.



Rotary Club of Charlottetown Scholarship: To be eligible you must be a physically disabled person who is entering or continuing studies at Holland college or the University of Prince Edward Island. You must also be a resident of PEI. The deadline for this \$500. scholarship is April 15 (tentative date).

The University Women's Club of St. John: This \$600. scholarship is for a female student who will be entering her final year of undergraduate study in September 1988. You must be a graduate of a high school in NB School District 19 or 20. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of a student's academic standing and financial need. Deadline March 31.

Thelma Sewell Memorial Scholarship/NB Home Economics Association: This \$1200. scholarship is for a graduate of a High School in NB who has evidence of a genuine interest in Home Economics or related subject areas. Applicants must have applied for admission to a Bachelor's degree program in Home Economics in any Province in Canada, and they must have achieved good results in a variety of high school subjects, including the applied sciences. Deadline is May 31.

There it is for this week fellow students! Some of the available money is quite selective, but there are other sources coming up in the not so distant future. Remember, the "Search for the Green" begins with you!
