Four-Power Conference May Wind Up This Week

GENEVA (AP) — The crisis-ridden four-power foreign ministers conference may wind up this week. Western officials on the spot saw only a slender chance that some Berlin agreement might be salvaged from the talks. The British camp professed more hope than the United States and French delegations that something can yet be pulled out of the bag. The Soviet line remained unchanged—that there remained a prospect of agreement on Moscow's terms.

In the last few days the Western powers and the Soviet Union made slight pullbacks which kept the negotiations barely alive. They may find a way of ending the talks under a recess-arrangement.

There has been no rush by either side to break off the talks completely. The implications of the Berlin issue show that both the Western powers and the Soviet Union are in a tight corner. **WANT SUMMIT TALKS**

If the conference finally collapses, the Western powers expect a greatly amplified Soviet propaganda campaign to take the Berlin and German problems to a summit meeting regardless of the disagreements uncovered by the foreign ministers.

U.S. officials stressed that the West would turn down Soviet Premier Khrushchev's bid for top-level talks unless the Russians come through with proposals preserving Western rights in Berlin.

The U.S., Britain and France agreed that the Russians' one-

year deadline on allied rights in West Berlin never can be accepted.

U.S. State Secretary Christian Herter and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko remained in Geneva during the weekend to study possible ways out of the diplomatic maze.

French Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville and British Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd returned to their capitals for consultations.

Lloyd urged patience. He arranged weekend talks with Prime Minister Macmillan—the Western leader most disposed to go to the summit.

Monday morning Lloyd will re-

port to the British cabinet. He will fly back for the private afternoon session of the four ministers in Couve de Murville's Geneva residence.

In the Western view Monday and Tuesday are the critical days. If no avenue of East-West understanding on Berlin opens up then Western diplomats feel it might be better to stop arguing, at least for a while.

The four ministers might decide to recess rather than break off their talks with the understanding that they would re-assemble next month or later in the summer. They could refer their unresolved problems to deputies during the recess.

Principal Hagen Is Remembered

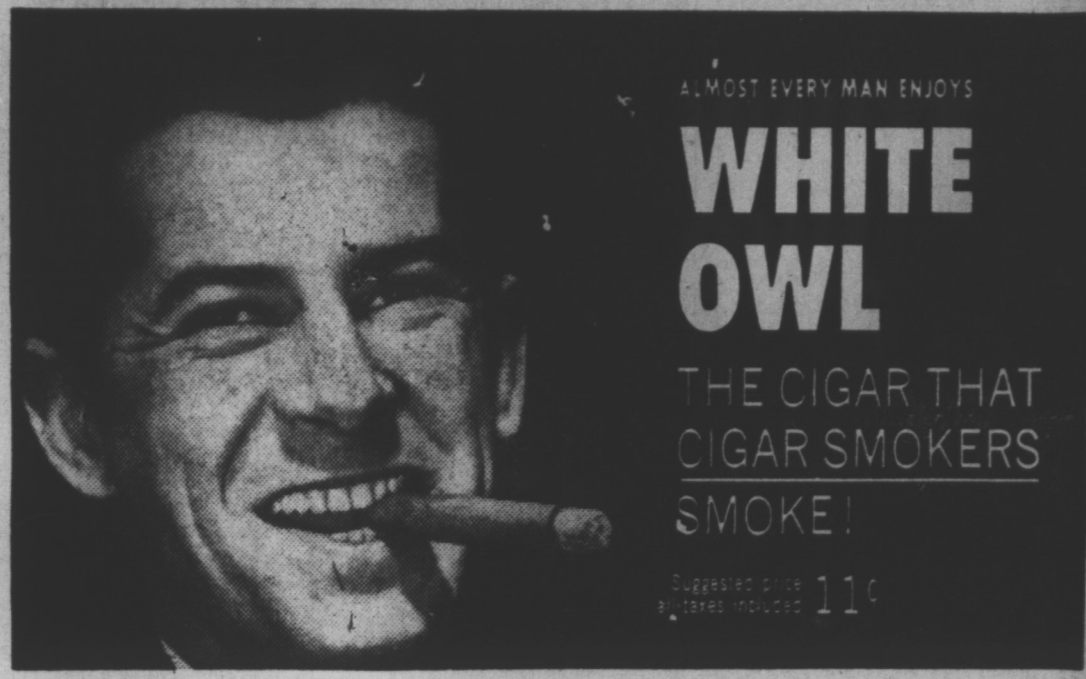
TRURO (CP) — Students at Central Colchester High School here dedicated their year book to

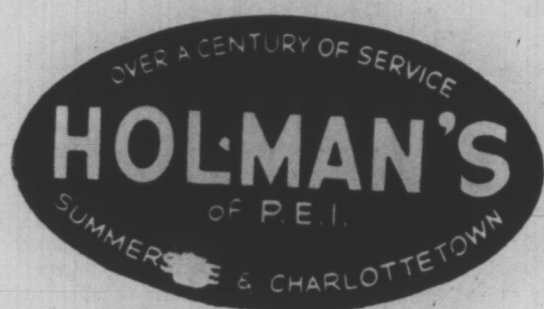

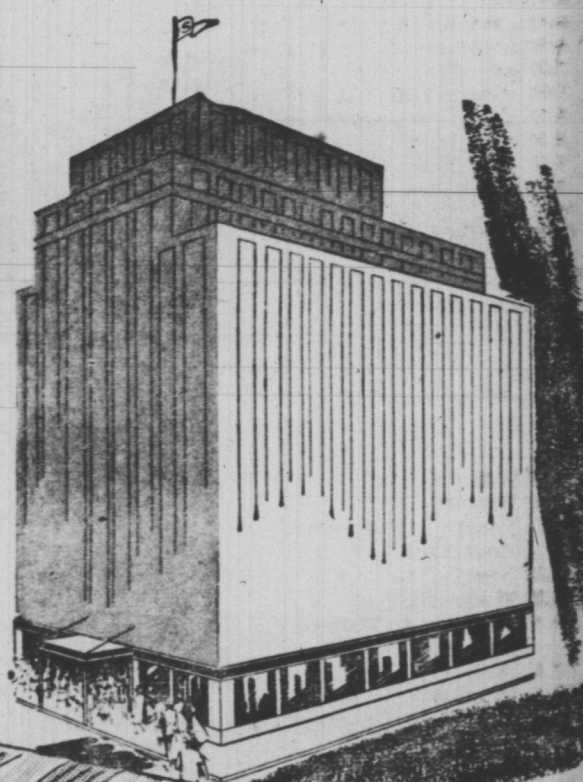
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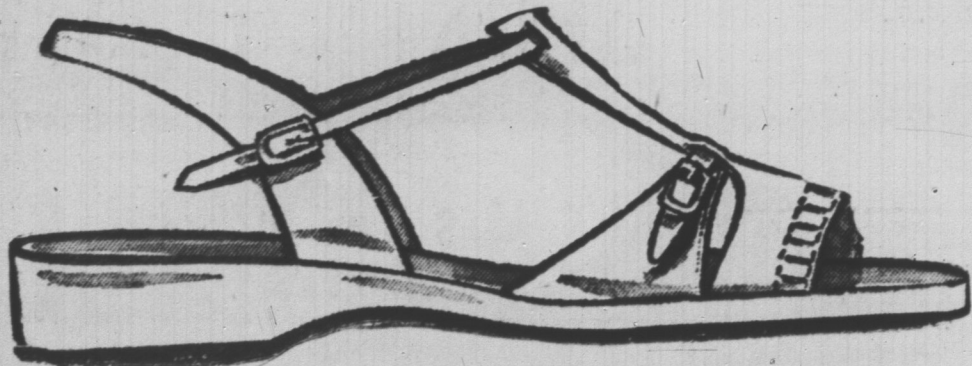
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
