Paula Foley: "Paula, you are so stupid".

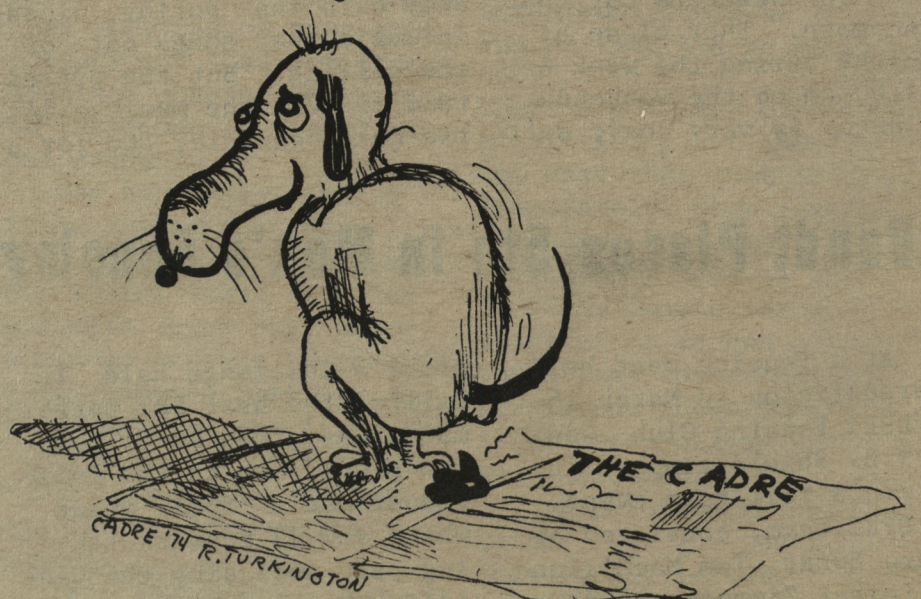
Richard Willis: I'm wishy- washy".
