U.P.E.I. TO HOLD ITS FIRST TERRY FOX RUN

U.P.E.I. students, faculty, and staff will be joining thousand of Canadians who will walk, jog, wheel and run the Terry Fox Run on Sunday, September 15th. This is the first time U.P.E.I. has organized to help the cause of the Run, but organizers Karen Blacquiere and Miles Turnbull expect a "huge turn-out". Participants and volunteers will take part in the Run/Walk and then get together in the Panther Lounge for refreshments and celebration. Anyone who can move can be a part of the Terry Fox Run!

The Terry Fox Run is meant to be a fun, spirited day to commemorate Terry Fox and help raise money for Cancer Research. Many people still feel very strongly about the cause for which Terry Fox gave his life. His mother, Betty Fox, describes the run as a "fight". "Terry's dream was to find a cure for Cancer. We're still fighting for that dream."

Many different groups are

joining in this fight. The U.P.E.I. freshmen have a headstart because most of them received Terry Fox Run pledge sheets in the mail. Before they even left home, they were getting sponsors for their part in the Run. It is expected that the freshmen will lead the other classes in participation! Obviously this issues a challenge to the upper-classes.

The U.P.E.I. Soccer Panthers are taking the initiative to use the Terry Fox Run as a "practice to help a good cause". Glenn Smiley, team captain says, "The guys need a run anyway. I can't think of a better reason to run on a Sunday. The Terry Fox Run is something we all believe in." They're hoping the other athletic teams will get involved as well.

Student Medical Plan 1985/86

All *full-time U.P.E.I. students automatically become members of the Blue Cross Medical plan and are charged a \$36.00 fee. If you are covered by another medical plan, however, you may withdraw from the Blue Cross plan.

Please do not wait until

you receive your student loan. Once you have registered you may pick up your refund at the Student Union office, Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Bring your 1986 student card or a receipt from the University and proof of another medical plan and your \$36.00 will be refunded.

If you are only covered by Provincial Medicare you will not be eligible for a refund.

Any student interest in a family medical plan from Blue Cross please contact the Student Union office before September 14, 1985.

Refunds are only available

until September 14, 1985.

Blue Cross cards will not be available until November 1, 1985. If you purchase a prescription before Nov. 1, 1985, hold the receipt until your Blue Cross card arrives; then mail the receipts to the Blue Cross for a refund.

ENGLISH COURSES FOR FRESHMEN

Recognizing the importance of literature to everyone's education, the English Department welcomes first-year students into most of its 200-level courses. The Department's Supplement to the University Calendar contains information on all the English courses to be offered in 1985-86 and may be consulted at Registration.

Enrolment in English 101 is restricted to 25 students per section to allow instructors to handle weekly writing assignments and give students personal attention. Students who are unable to enter fall-semester 101 sections should bear in mind that they may take the course in any semester before graduation and that the enrolment is normally lighter in

spring semesters.

English 192 sections are limited to 40 students each because the course has a substantial writing component, though assignments are less frequent than those of English 101. Several sections of 192 are taught in every semester. Business students may, with permission from their school, substitute another course for 192 to complete their English graduation requirements.

Since 1984, the English Department has offered an Honour program as well as an English major. Interested students should consult pp. 81-82 of the current University Calendar. Members of the Department will be happy to answer questions.
