

Alberton Branch Of Bible Society Annual Meeting

Rev. E. M. B. Wheelock, district secretary of the British and Foreign Bible Society addressed the annual meeting of Alberton branch held in the United Church hall Friday evening. Opening words were conducted by Rev. J. R. McMahon, rector of St. Peter's Anglican Church, assisted by Rev. George Killeen, minister of the Presbyterian Church, who led in prayer. Miss Maud Dyer, president of Alberton branch conducted a brief business meeting. The secretary-treasurer, Miss Margaret Forsyth, read the minutes of the last annual meeting and reported receipts to date of this year's canvass. A vote of thanks to the collectors was moved by Mrs. A. C. Green seconded by Miss Annie Leard and carried unanimously. The president appointed a nominating committee comprised of Mrs. A. C. Green, Rev. J. R. McMahon, Mrs. David Hodgson, bringing in a slate of officers at a meeting to be held during the week of prayer. Rev. C. D. Matheson of Summerside was introduced and spoke briefly. In sketching the work of the Bible Society Rev. Mr. Wheelock stated that there are a thousand languages into which no portion of the scriptures have yet been translated. The task of the Bible Society is the translation and circulation of the scriptures. For the blind the Bible is printed in Braille and also produced on records so that those who do not know Braille can hear the scriptures read. New Testaments are supplied to men of the armed forces and for immigrants there is published an edition with parallel columns, one in his native tongue and one in English. A very fine film "The Living Word" depicted in an interesting and memorable way some of the great work of the British and Foreign Bible Society. The benediction was pronounced by Rev. Mr. McMahon.

"HOUSE OF BAMBOO" AT THE CAPITOL, SUMMERSIDE

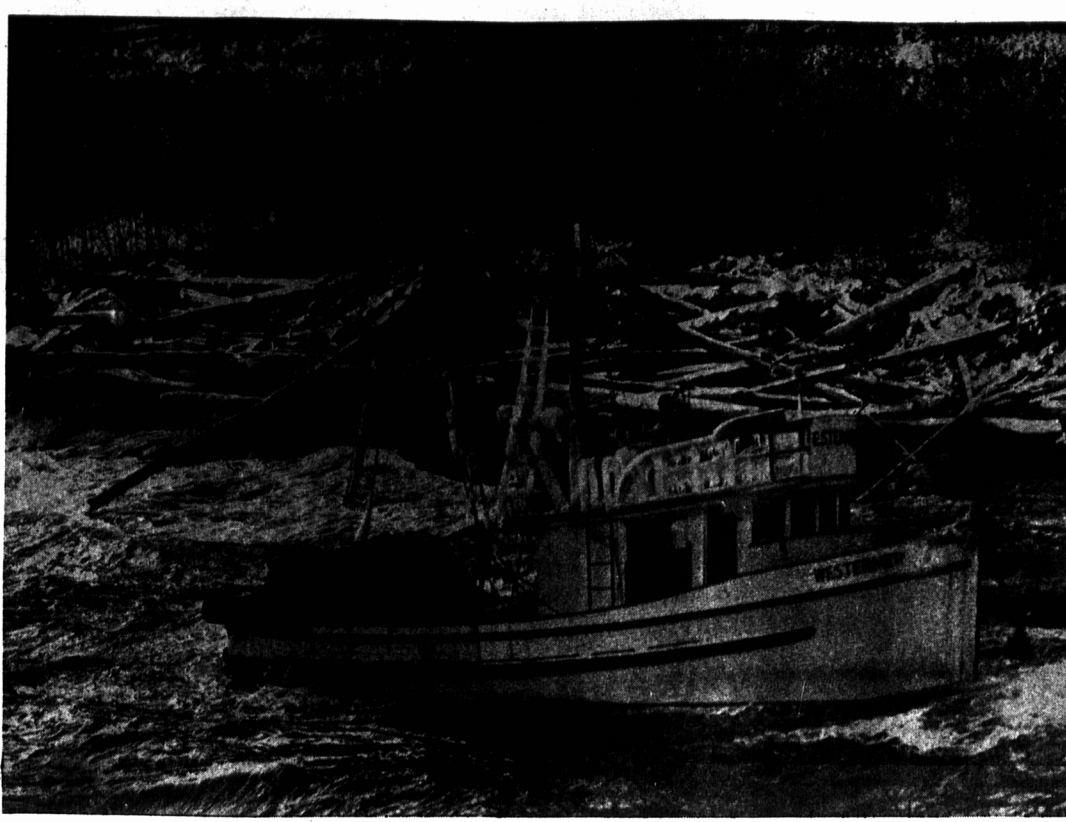
