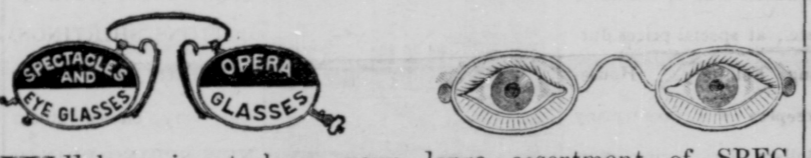

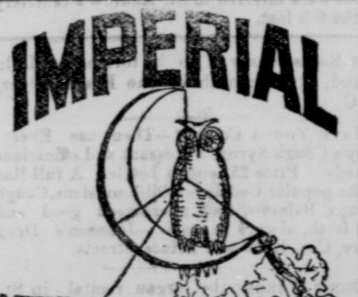

Temperance Notes.

(Contributed by the W. C. T. U.)
In my opinion, the best physical performance can only be secured through absolute abstinence from the use of alcohol and tobacco. This is my rule; and I find, after three years' constant work at the oar, during which time I have rowed many notable match races, that I am better able to contend in a great race than when I commenced. In fact, I believe that the use of liquor and tobacco has a very injurious effect upon the system of an athlete by irritating the vitals and consequently weakening the system.—Edward Hanlan.
The habit of intemperance by men in office has occasioned more injury to the public, and more trouble to me, than all other causes; and were I to commence my administration over again, the first question I would ask respecting a candidate for office would be, "Does he use ardent spirits?"—Thomas Jefferson.

The indulgence of intoxicating drink invariably results in causing employees to be careless and indifferent in the discharge of their duties, and ends in making them wholly incompetent for any kind of business, and a reproach and disgrace to their families and friends. We want our men to be clear headed. We ask of them to pursue such a course as will insure to them the confidence and respect of all good people in the community where they reside, or through which they pass in the discharge of their duties. They cannot indulge in strong drink and do this. In the future whenever it is known that an employe of this division drinks intoxicating liquor, no matter whether on duty or off duty, his instant dismissal from the employe of the company will follow.—Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company.

An experience of more than twenty years of judicial life has taught me that more than seven-eighths of the crimes committed in this country—which involve personal violence—were traceable to the use of intoxicating liquors. That all the causes of sin and misery, of pauperism and wretchedness, intoxicating liquor stands forth the unapproachable chief.—Noah Davis, Chief Justice of the New York Supreme Court.

Eighty per cent. of the crime of our country is the result of intemperance, and ninety-five per cent. of the depraved youth are the children of drunken and depraved households.—Gen. Eaton, United States Commissioner of Education.

Two-thirds of the crimes which come before the courts of law of this country are committed chiefly by intemperance.—Lord Chief Baron Kelly, of England.

I have prayed to God that he might destroy the whole beer brewing business, and the first brewer I have often cursed. There is enough barley destroyed in the breweries to feed all Germany.—Martin Luther.

Judging from my observation, lager beer is quite as likely to generate murder and crime as the stronger liquors. The one drunk on beer is really more dangerous than the one drunk on wine or whiskey.—Dr. M. L. Holbrook.

A whiskey drinker will commit murder only under the direct excitement of liquor—a beer drinker is capable of doing it in cold blood. Long observation has assured us that a large proportion of murders, deliberately planned and executed without passion or malice, with no other motive than the acquisition of property or money, often of trifling value, are perpetrated by beer-drinkers.—Pacific Medical Journal, endorsed by Home Life Ins. Co.

There is one dreadful evil overspreading the whole land which makes havoc of our workmen—the evil of intemperance. Was a Close Call.
ESCAPE OF KANSAS FROM BLOODSHED—NEARER THAN MOST PEOPLE WERE AWARE OF.

A recent special from Topeka, Kansas, says: "The real facts as to how bloodshed was avoided in Kansas are now coming to light, and it develops that it was a much closer call than most people are aware of, as Governor Jewell retracted the signature to the peace measures with 20 minutes after he had signed them.

Upon hearing of his intentions, Mr. Cubbin, of Wyandotte, went to him and said: "Governor, do I understand that you wish to take your name from this paper?"
The governor answered that he had signed it under duress and under mistaken ideas. Doctor is said to have been with him and told him that the populists would never forgive him, and possibly he would not escape serious trouble, so he decided to withdraw from the agreement.

Mr. Cubbin then said to him: "Governor, if you withhold your signature from the paper there will be 1,000 men killed within 20 minutes, and you will be one of them. The populists are ready to fight for their rights. It will tolerate imprisonment no longer. It has been hard to hold the members back. The sergeants-at-arms are ready and well armed, and the sheriff cannot control his men on the outside much longer. The fight will begin as soon as you say so, and it will begin in this corridor, in front of your office. Think what you are doing!"
Governor Jewell reached out his hand and said, "Give me the paper. Let it stand." This alone averted war.

The alternative was three months in goal, and as Hunsman had not the money he accepted the three months.

A REVIVAL IN JAIL.—A few days ago a prisoner in the Napanee, Ont., jail, while downcast seized a hymn book to relieve the monotony, and soon began reading and singing. Others listened, grew interested, and soon a revival was on, and the tramps and thieves became very devout. A clergyman called and spoke to them, and now declares their conversion to be genuine. Nightly they have praise and testimony meetings, and read eagerly every religious book, including the bible, they can secure.

NEW BRUNSWICK MORALS.—A committee of the Woodstock, N. B., Town Council concluded a recent report to the Council with this remarkable sentence: "Your committee would advise the night watch and marshal to keep on the alert for all places of ill repute and endeavor to have the guilty parties brought to justice. A REMARKABLE CASE.—The town of Bridgewater, N. S., was considerably excited on Tuesday last on account of a sensational occurrence in the court room of Justice Curll. A trial for breach of the liquor law was in progress when two constables from Lunenburg came with a warrant issued by Andrew Gardner, J. P., for the arrest of Justice Curll for an alleged forgery committed in August, 1883. Mr. Curll was so overcome by the shock that he fainted and was with some difficulty resuscitated by the lawyers in court. Justice Curll, who was sitting with Justice Curll on the suit, becoming incensed at the action of the constables, ordered some constables present to eject and imprison the constable who was arresting Mr. Curll. During the melee the constable from Lunenburg, whose name is Arthur Young, was seized by Justice Curll and the constables attending the court and ejected. Mr. Curll was re-arrested after the trial was over and taken to Lunenburg.
