The Tory government in Ontario has shown it has by no means exhausted the methods by which it can penalize the people for the crisis the people had no part in creating. The government now plans to force mothers out into the workforce to do jobs no one else will do - the dirty jobs; and the penalty for refusing will be to forfeit welfare or U.I.C. No mention is made of course of how these mothers will be capable of paying for daycare. These jobs will be low-paying hardly enough to pay for daycare with not enough left over to live on. But because they'll be working that

will justify cutting off their benefits!

The government does not care however, as long as it saves money for more profitable investment for the fat corporations!

This is but an addition to an already deplorable state of affairs for the people of this country. In Ontario alone, over 1,000,000 students will be out of work this summer adding to the 1,000,000 and who are already out of work in Canada. They cannot, as in the past, rely on L.I.P.; O.F.Y.; C.Y.C., and other people-oriented programs, because they have been discontinued - "to save money."

Meanwhile, however, prices (and profits!) continue to soar.

You have heard, time and again, that the government of Canada as well as the provincial and municipal governments, are cutting back to stop unnecessary spending. But who is benefiting from this saving? If it was the people (which they hypocritically maintain), then why is it that the people are the ones who must suffer by going without jobs, money adequate medical and dental care, etc?

The capitalists and their corporations are not suffering - nor are their servants - the politicians, newspaper editors, etc.

To exemplify this, a quotation from "The Canadian Tribune" reveals: "Nowhere in the economy - are the ravages of inflation worse, nowhere does the price and profit spiral snatch away more of working people's earnings through taxes than in reckless government squandering to enrich the arms monopolies."

"What better example than the outrageous purchase by Canada of 18 U.S. sub-chaser aircraft from the financially and morally bereft Lockheed Corporation. A fighter plane in World War II cost \$54,000. An F-111, used by the USA to slaughter the people of Vietnam, cost \$6,800,000. The 18 Lockheed Orions now on order for Canada will cost taxpayers \$52,000,000 each! To add insult to robbery, the Canadian Government plans to finance the deal for the corrupt Lockheed Corporation. "Canada is pouring \$3 billion a year down the "defence" drain, raising it 12% annually, plus inflation, and at the same time denying Canadians needed monies for medicare."

## Blood Needed

Dear Sir:

My brother, Ian, was born with a serious heart condition - he was what is known as a "blue baby". Doctors agreed that he was not strong enough to survive an operation. At this time - 1959 - research in heart surgery was still in its pioneer stage.

For twenty years, Ian lived a semi-sheltered life, unable to participate in any vigorous activity, and subject to much illness. Several times during this period he was brought through crises by the expert care of Dr. Hubert O'Hanley.

By the spring of 1974, Ian's condition had greatly deteriorated. Doctors in Toronto advised that surgery was his only hope and referred him to the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. Surgeons there performed the difficult operation of replacing the pulmonary artery and patching a large hole in the main wall of the heart. Many units of fresh blood of the patient's type are required to be on hand

before this operation can be attempted. During the surgery, Ian hemorrhaged and the efforts of the surgeons would have ended in failure had an abundant supply of fresh blood not been available. This blood was provided through the American National Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service which has a reciprocal agreement with the Canadian Red Cross Society.

Today, Ian enjoys good health for the first time the freedom of independence and the satisfaction of full-time employment.

Our family will always be grateful to the donors who give their blood so that others may live, and to the Red Cross through which this service is made available for all who need it.

I urge my fellow students to make every effort to be blood donors at the Red Cross Blood Donor Clinics to be held at U.P.E.I. Gym. This is coming Wednesday, March 31st. from 7-9 P.M., or on Thursday, April 1st. from 10 - 12 Noon and 2 - 4 P.M. when 360 units of blood must be collected to meet the current week's needs for patients in hospitals in P.E.I. and Nova Scotia requiring this life-saving and life-giving fluid which only

PEOPLE can provide.
