War in The Transvaal

Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.

OUR SECOND CONTINGENT.

Ottawa, Dec. 28.—Hon. Mr. Borden gave out the list of the officers of the contingent last night with the exception of the two squadrons to be selected in Manitoba and the Northwest from the Mounted Police, ex-mounted policemen, rough riders and others. Instead of sending three squadrons of mounted riders, as at first decided upon, there will be now two squadrons of mounted rifles and two squadrons of mounted policemen and others. This will increase the contingent to over 12,000 in strength. The mounted infantry will be a separate organization from the other two squadrons. The commissioner of the Northwest Mounted Police is now organizing them and their officers will be announced later. The batteries remain as already announced.

With the exception of the two irregular squadrons all the officers are as follows:—
Canadian Mounted Rifles—Two Squadrons.

Staff—Lieut. Col. Lessard, R. C. D. to command; second in command, Lieut. Col. T. D. Evans, R. C. D., Adjutant Capt. C. M. Nelles, R. C. D., transport officer, Capt. C. F. Harrison, 8th Princess Louise Hussars (N. B.); quarter master, Capt. Wynne, 2nd Garrison Artillery (Montreal); medical officer, Surgeon Major H. R. Duff, 4th Hussars (Kingston); veterinary officer, Major Hall, R. C. D. (Toronto).

The other two squadrons will be selected from the Northwest Mounted Police, ex-mounted Police, Rough Riders and others. The officers will be announced later. They will be selected from the Mounted Police and will be recommended by the commissioner and afterwards approved by the minister of militia.
