Island Baptists Hold Meeting At Kingsboro

Yesterday the P. E. I. United Baptist District met at the Kingsboro Baptist Church with District Chairman Rev. G. Walter Killam of Tryon presiding and Rev. C. A. Britten of Central Bechuqua as Clerk. Following morning devotions and a welcome from the East Point pastor, Lic. Donald McClare, Rev. Mr. Britten presented the Keyman's Report which showed a considerable financial increase to Denominational Funds. Rev. Mr. Killam reported for the United Baptist Bible Training School, stating that several graduates plan further study for foreign mission work or for the ministry at home. The School is almost free of debt and plans to construct a residence.

Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

A resident of Montague was fined \$50 and costs and had his drivers license cancelled for three months by Magistrate Joseph W. MacDonald at Georgetown Monday for operating a motor vehicle while his ability was impaired by alcohol. A resident of Murray Harbour received the same penalty for a similar offense. A resident of Point Pleasant was fined \$20 and costs for consuming liquor in a vehicle. Having been intoxicated in a public place, a resident of Murray Harbour was fined \$20 and costs. The case of a resident of Dundee charged with possession of illicit spirits, was adjourned. The Montague detachment, R. C. M. P. prosecuted the cases.

Supreme Court At Georgetown

The adjourned sitting of the July session of the Supreme Court of Kings County was held at Georgetown yesterday morning with Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell presiding. The first case was the Queen vs. Joseph Gabriel MacDonald, charged with rape. The Grand Jury brought in a true bill. Mr. S. S. Hessian, Q. C., acting for the crown made a motion for a stay of proceedings in this case. The motion was granted. Mr. H. F. McPhee, Q. C., appeared for the accused. In an appeal case, under the Excise Act, in which evidence was taken at the court sitting in July, the Queen vs. Quentin Dennis Mossman, the Chief Justice ruled that the decision of the stipendiary magistrate be reversed and the conviction and sentence quashed. No order was made as to costs. The court then adjourned sine die.

*HUGE JET PLANNED LONDON—(CP)—A jet airliner capable of carrying 150 passengers between London and New York is on the drawing-boards of the Handley-Page Company. The plans envision a two-deck craft with a 25-ton load capacity. In the absence of Island Secretary Dr. Zella Clark, Mrs. T. G. Ives of Charlottetown presided, with Mrs. Jack MacLeod of Summerside as Secretary. This year concluded 20 years as Supt. of Island Mission Bands for Mrs. Ives. The general report was read by Mrs. J. A. Clark of Charlottetown and showed a \$400 increase in moneys raised, with the Knutsford Church leading the P. E. I. Honor Roll. Mrs. A. K. MacPhee of Charlottetown reported that the past year was best in some time for Mission Bands. The guest speaker was Mrs. Henry Allaby, Supt. of the Maritime Union's White Cross mission relief work. She reviewed the Baptist missionary heritage and history among the Telegus of India. Mrs. Allaby stressed it as a God-given task to minister to the 176 churches in the community of 100,000 in 24 missionary areas. The evening service featured the ordination of Lic. Donald McClare to the ministry. Rev. W. G. Killam presided, and Rev. M. Watterworth of New Glasgow, P. E. I., read scripture. Following the ordination sermon preached by Rev. Gordon McClare of Oxford, N.S., the charge to the candidate was given by Rev. J. D. Davison and the charge

to the Church by Rev. H. Barber of North River. After the laying on of hands Rev. H. S. Allaby welcomed Mr. McClare into the ministry and Rev. Bertram Corkum of the Souris United Church welcomed Mr. McClare on behalf of his Church. Rev. S. A. Britten led in prayer, and Rev. Donald McClare pronounced the benediction.

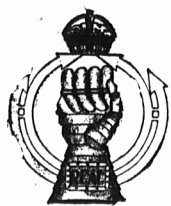
