

35 4-H Club girls to Attend Course

Thirty-five members of 4-H Clubs from across the Island will meet in Charlottetown next week for a five-day series of lectures, discussions and demonstrations. It was announced yesterday by Miss Margaret MacLeod, director of women's services for the provincial department of agriculture.

The girls, especially selected for the week's program, will spend a session Monday afternoon at the Vocational School. The course under the direction of the Women's Institute branch of the agriculture department, will see the girls given instruction in grooming, clothing selection, care of fabrics, table service, nutrition and meal planning.

In addition they will also receive training in leadership topics such as introducing speakers, proposing toasts and conducting meeting programs.

Information on the requirements and possibilities of various careers will be discussed during the week by a panel of qualified personnel. Following this discussion the girls will have the opportunity to ask questions and explore the various answers.

One of the highlights of the week will be a dinner scheduled for Thursday night at the Charlottetown Hotel. The dinner being planned by the girls and will give them the opportunity of carrying out many of the things they learned during the week.

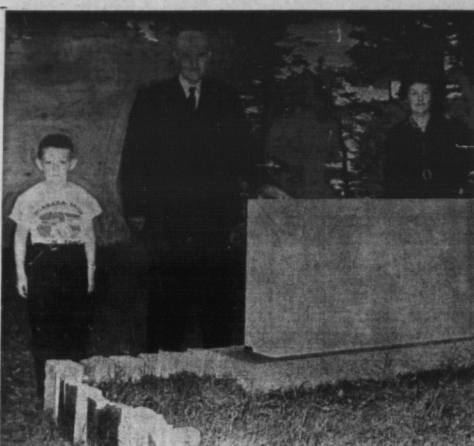

The group toured the pasture fields and were quite surprised at how good the pasture looked considering that 44 cattle were grazing on 33 acres of land. The milk cows are grazed over three fields, changing every three weeks. Mr. Matheson then clipped some fields and several of his young cattle have three fields and he also changes them once a week. He either manures or fertilizes each field annually.

Five of the six fields have been in grass since 1967 and will be kept in grass as long as grass conditions remain good.

Following the tour of pastures the group had a general discussion on pasture management.

One of the farmers present said he was able to gain 30 a week in milk receipts from a fertilized field over one that had not been fertilized.

Value Of Lobster Catch Increased

The value of the landed lobster catch in Prince Edward Island for this year, to date, shows an increase of \$165,294 over the catch for the same period last year. It was learned yesterday from statistics compiled by the P.E.I. department of fisheries.

The figures are for the spring season, which opened May 1 this year and concluded July 3, covering the area from North Point along the north, east and south shores to Victoria. The area between Victoria and North Point will be fished from Aug. 10 to Oct. 10.

This year's catch in May and June was 8,530,274 pounds, which is down slightly from the 8,599,367 pounds landed in the same period in 1961. But higher prices paid fishermen 1.14 1/2 cents per pound for this year brought the value of this

year's haul to \$2,200,000, which is more than the \$2,227,657 received by the fishermen a year ago for the larger haul.

Fisheries officials said yesterday that there will be some further statistics, which will boost catch totals higher.
