**Don Jackson Could Capture Skating Title**

TORONTO (CP)—Don Jackson, who couldn't stand up on skates 13 years ago, could give Canada a world figure-skating title next month.

The 20-year-old white on blades has been cutting a fancy figure in world circles since 1957 and this time his admirers in North America believe he can go all the way to the top. The big test is scheduled for Prague March 14-17 when the world championships are held.

But there's one little obstacle—the Canadian senior men's title—in his way. And he's sure to take it for the fourth straight year when the 51st Canadian championships close here Saturday night.

The three-day tournament opens today with all sorts of titles to be decided in men's and women's senior and junior brackets, senior and junior pairs and dance championships. Sticking out above all entries is the five-foot-eight figure of Jackson, a native of Oshawa, Ont., and considered one of the best free skaters in the world.

Seventeen skaters will be chosen late Saturday night for the world championships. This was the word Wednesday from Nigel Stephens of Toronto, president of the Canadian Figure Skating Association. The CFSA has decided to send three pairs, three dance twosomes, three men and two women.

Other "cinches" are the Canadian North American pairs champions—the brother-sister combination of Maria and Otto Jelinek of Oakville, Ont.; Virginia Thompson from St. Catharines, Ont., and Bill McLachlan of Toronto, Canadian and North American dance pairs title holders, and 15-year-old Wendy Griner of Toronto, Canadian women's champion the last two years and runner-up in the 1961 North American at Philadelphia.

All will defend their Canadian titles this week.
