Canada Plans to Extend Tariff-Ratebating Program

WASHINGTON (CP)—External Affairs Minister Martin says the Canadian government intends to extend its tariff-ratebating program to support the chemical production of the program on automobile rebates fully developed.

However, Finance Minister Gordon questions whether the automotive formula is the most desirable to other industries, suggesting that some other scheme may be developed.

And Opposition Leader Diefenbaker challenges the welfare of the program, saying the automotive incentive program is very wrongly done, wrongly applied and will be ineffective.

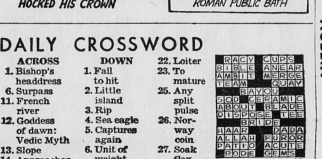
