KATMANDU, Nepal (AP)—Legese mountain climbing expedition says the Hindu god of destruction and his wife live atop Mount Gauri Shankar, 75 miles east of here on the Nepal.

Officials fear the expedition led by Hideko Kato of Japan perished in recent avalanches cascading down the unexplored peak. But some alpinists here still speculate the group may have tried to climb the mountain's northern face in Tibet and been taken prisoner by Communist Chinese troops that probably occupy the area.

In 1954, Swiss alpinist Raymond Lambert, who unsuccessfully tried to scale the blizzard-swept mountain, said it could not be climbed above 21,000 feet on the Nepali side and suggested climbers try it from Tibet.

AIR SEARCH FAILS

A Nepalese aerial search Saturday failed to find any trace of the expedition. Flying at 19,000 feet, a plane circled six times around the area where Kato, his two Japanese companions, a Nepalese college student, two Sherpa guides and 25 porters were last heard of after leaving their base camp 18,000 feet up Mount Gauri Shankar more than three weeks ago.

Although the plane was unable to fly higher, the passengers, including Nepalese Transport Minister Ganesman Singh, could scan the upper slopes of the mountain. They were accompanied by two Japanese physicians and the Sherpa runner who brought news Friday that the climbers were missing.

Prime Minister B. P. Koirala sent out ground search parties, but they are not expected to report back for 10 days.

Gauri Shankar, about 35 miles west of the world's highest mountain—29,002-foot Mount Everest—lies in a semicircle of border mountains that include Mount Cho Oyu, which took the lives of two European women climbers and two Sherpa guides last month.

If the expedition is lost, it will be the worst Himalayan disaster in history.

Youth Survey Shows Attitude

WEDNESBURY, England (AP)—Wedgesbury citizens got the results Saturday of a survey they sponsored to find out what the town's teen-agers like to do in their free time.

They like to neck, the survey shows.

The result came as no surprise to many, but the mayor, George Stokes, took a dim view.

"This survey is rubbish," he declared. "The youth of this town are hard working and industrious. You only have to go into night schools and technical colleges here to see that."

DIFFERENT VIEW

Town Alderman Arthur Biswell, chairman of a local youth centre, reacted differently.

"A spot of necking does the youngsters good," he said. "The brain can become overworked with too much study and that sort of relaxation helps a lot."

The survey was conducted by a Roman Catholic Church organization known as the Young Christian Workers. Backed by the townspop, the organization distributed 100 questionnaires in coffee bars frequented by teen-agers and in local youth clubs.

The purpose was to establish how teen-agers in this Midland English town spend leisure hours. Wednesbury, one of Britain's big iron towns near Birmingham, has 34,000 citizens and its fair share of youth problems.

The survey showed that boys look for a combination of Brigitte Bardot-Marilyn Monroe type as their ideal girl. Girls, seek kindness, patience and understanding in their boy friends.

Mayor Stokes conceded Wednesbury youngsters "may do a spot of necking" but added:

"This is an international hobby not peculiar to Wednesbury. To suggest that it is all they do in their leisure time is bunk."

Said Alderman Biswell:

"What's wrong with necking as a hobby? As long as the youngsters behave themselves, it's a jolly good thing. It helps them get to know each other's habits and mix together better."
