

Johnson Presents Congress With New Bill For Viet Nam

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson and his defence chief have handed the U. S. Congress a bill and specifications for waging harder war in Viet Nam and girding for possible trouble elsewhere.

The request would add \$1,700,000,000 to the \$45,200,000,000 in military appropriation requests now in Congress.

It also would add, among other things, 340,000 more men to the armed forces, bringing the total by next June to 2,960,000. A worsening of the situation could raise that figure.

Part of the 340,000-man expansion would be to fill vacancies left by the sending of 50,000 more men to South Viet Nam during the next few months.

Johnson, following up his announcement of last Wednesday that forces in Viet Nam will be

increased by 50,000 to a new total of 125,000, asked the Senate in a letter for an "emergency fund" for an augmentation of the military effort until Congress begins its new session next January.

Defence Secretary Robert S. McNamara, appearing before the Senate defence appropriations subcommittee put into detailed figures what is needed in men, money and munitions.

Senator J. Dan Rostenkowski (D., Ill.), who presided at the closed session, commented that "obviously this is not all that will be needed."

The secretary borrowed some of the thinking and phrases from Johnson's announcement last week to set the scene for the administration's money request.

"What is at stake there (in South Viet Nam) is the ability of the free world to block Communist armed aggression and prevent the loss of all of Southeast Asia, a loss which in its ultimate consequences would drastically alter the strategic situation in Asia and the Pacific to the grave detriment of our own security and that of our allies."

"The struggle there has enormous implications for the security of the United States and the free world, and for that matter, the Soviet Union as well."

Vietnamese and Chinese Communists have chosen to make South Viet Nam the test case for the Asian version of "wars of national liberation."

McNamara spelled out these details.

The regular army should be increased by 235,000 men, the marine corps would get 30,000 more men for its three air wings, the navy would receive a 35,000-man addition and the air force a 40,000-man augmentation of personnel.

Commenting that "we must be prepared to deploy additional forces to Southeast Asia over and above those now planned, and to be ready for dealing with crises elsewhere in the world," McNamara told of the need to bring military reserve outfits up to a readiness condition.

Trawler Finds Torpedo At Sea

PORTSMOUTH, Va. (AP)—A deep-sea trawler picked up Thursday a torpedo off the Virginia coast in waters 40 miles north of a point where the trawler Snoopy was blown to bits by a similar catch last month.

But wary after the find that took eight lives in the Snoopy blast off Hatteras, the trawler, New Bedford, didn't try to bring the torpedo aboard.

Instead it reported to fifth district U. S. Coast Guard headquarters it was rigging the net containing the 10-foot cylinder to a fishing buoy and retiring to a safe distance.

The coast guard ordered the area 35 miles southeast of the cleared of other vessels.

Opening lead—ace of clubs. No one can possibly be a really good dummy player until he has trained himself to precede the play of each hand with the formulation of a plan. Frequently the play to a particular trick—even though it appears to be automatic—cannot be segregated successfully from the play of the hand as a whole.

opening leads, but selected the only lead that had a chance to defeat the contract. He led the ace of clubs and continued with the queen.

Declarer played the king from dummy and East ruffed. East returned a heart and South followed with the ten in order to give himself a chance to make the contract. West won the heart with the king and cashed the jack of clubs to defeat the contract a trick.

Despite the inspired defense, South should have made four spades. He should not have played the king of clubs when West led the queen at trick two.

By ducking the queen he would have protected himself against all possibility of defeat. Thus, in the actual case, West's best play of continuing with a club at trick three, which East would ruff, would have given the defenders their third—but last—trick.

South would win any return, draw trumps, ruff a club, and discard a heart from dummy on the nine of clubs.

Of course, it can be argued that ducking the queen raises the chance of the king being ruffed (if West has three clubs and East two). This is true enough, of course, but it falls to argue to the heart of the matter, namely, fulfillment of the contract.

Admittedly, ducking the queen may lose a trick, but it cannot be the cause of losing the contract. Covering the queen may gain a trick, but it jeopardizes the contract. Between these alternatives the choice is clear. Making the contract is always the first consideration.
