NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market Monday started trading for the second half of 1963 with another sinking spell. Trading was light.

The ticker tape dragged frequently as volume totalled a sub-average 3,380,000 shares compared with 3,020,000 Friday. The Dow Jones industrial average of 60 stocks declined 1.7 to 269.2. It was the sharpest decline since last Wednesday when the average fell 2.4. An estimated \$2,600,000,000 was clipped from the quoted value of stocks listed

U.S. Showing Concern Over British Guiana

LONDON (AP) - The British government has expressed concern over the crisis in Georgetown, Guyana.

U.S. State Secretary Dean Rusk talked last weekend with the British Foreign Secretary, Lord Home, about the situation in British Guiana.

The United States is said to be worried also by indications that the Marxist premier is beginning to learn more and more on Cuba and to turn to the Soviet Union for economic support.

For several weeks the Macmillan government has been considering suspending the colony's status as a British territory. The British government is said to be directly with the backing of British troops.

Jagan indicated in Georgetown that he will continue trading with Cuba and the Soviet Union.

"What is my country to do?" he demanded. "We've tried to get help from all Western countries in the form of aid, but they have all refused."

Jagan said he has received no reply to a letter sent to Kennedy in April outlining British Guiana's needs and requesting aid.

Jagan also said he has asked the U.S. for permission to use an air base, to store Cuban gasoil and diesel fuel.

British Guiana's recent attempt to use the facilities drew a U.S. protest.

Jagan scoffed at opposition claims that the bill was aimed at giving him dictatorial powers.
