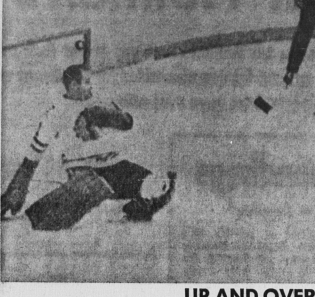

Rangers Blank Canadiens As Gump Steals Spotlight

NEW YORK (AP)—New York Rangers, cast in the role of spoilers, crushed any hopes Montreal had of finishing second in the National Hockey League by whipping the Canadiens 5-0 Sunday night in the regular season final game for the club.

This was a game Montreal had to win in order to have a mathematical chance of the finishing in sole possession of the runner-up spot ahead of Chicago Black Hawks. But the Rangers dashed Canadiens' chances before the Chicago-Boston game ended.

Four of the New York goals came on power plays—two by Camille Henry—as the fifth-place Rangers completely out-classed Montreal. Goaltender Gump Worsley was outstanding in the nets, making 27 saves as he turned in his second shutout and snapped the Canadiens' six-game unbeaten streak.

In winning, New York tied Montreal in the season's series. Each club had five victories, five losses and four ties in their meetings during the season.

TEMPERS HOT
Tempers flared mid-way in the third period and Ken Schinkel of the Rangers and Billy Hicke received major penalties for fighting.

Henry put New York in front 1-0 early in the opening period, tipping in a shot by Earl Ingarfield.

Andy Bathgate, second in the scoring race to Detroit's Gordie Howe, picked up an assist on the first goal and scored the Rangers' last goal late in the

game. He finished with 81 points on 35 goals and 46 assists. Don MacKenzie scored from close range half-way through the second period and Ken Schinkel's breakaway goal a minute later made it 5-0.

Henry produced his 37th goal of the season, an unassisted tally, at 13:04 of the final period and Bathgate wound up the evening on a happy note for the partisan crowd of 14,222 at Madison Square Garden with his 35th goal.

This was the lowest finish for the Canadiens since the 1950-51 season when they also wound up third. Montreal had won the league championship five years in a row before Toronto broke its domination this season.

Black Hawks Edge Lowly Bostonians

BOSTON (AP) — Chicago clinched second place and its steady goaltender, Glenn Hall, won the Vezina Trophy in the final game of the National Hockey League season Sunday night as the Black Hawks defeated Boston Bruins 4-3.

Once again it was a third-period comeback by the big muscular Black Hawks that carried them through as Bill Hay, Ron Murphy and Eric Nesterenko scored in rapid succession to wipe out a 2-1 Boston lead.

Chicago ending the season with 81 points to third-place Montreal's 79 had come back from a 4-1 deficit to tie the Canadiens 4-4 Saturday night and kept their position in the tense race.

Boston rookie Matt Pavlich recalled from the Providence farm club for the game, scored at 14 minutes, 49 seconds of the third period and kept Hall's Vezina triumph in doubt until the last moment.

FIRST TROPHY TRIUMPH
This marked the first time in his eight NHL seasons that Hall had won the Vezina, awarded to the goalie playing the most games for the team allowing the fewest goals.

He succeeds six-time winner Jacques Plante of Montreal, who lost a 5-0 verdict at New York Sunday night.
