Supreme Court Sitting Opens At Summerside

Mr. Justice Mark R. MacGuigan presided at the opening of the Supreme Court in Summerside yesterday. There were two indictments, three civil jury cases, and two non-jury cases on the docket, and judgment was given on a point of law that had been referred to the court for a decision.
 True bills were found by the Grand Jury in the two indictable cases, and in the first one to come before the court, Leo Joseph Devar, Bedeque, pleaded guilty to incest and was sentenced to three years in Dorchester Penitentiary. Attorney General Walter E. Darby represented the Crown and W. Chester S. MacDonald appeared for the accused.
 In the second indictment, Melvin Charles Ramsay, charged with manslaughter (motor manslaughter) in connection with the death of James O'Meara in a highway accident near Alberton on August 2nd, pleaded not guilty and his trial will commence today. In this case the Crown will be represented by Attorney General Walter E. Darby and J. Harold Goodwin, and the accused will be represented by Mr. D. O. Stewart and Mr. J. A. Gallant.

Decide To Form S'side Film Council
 Representatives of eighteen organizations in Summerside, including churches, church groups, service clubs and credit unions met last evening at the Summerside High School library to consider the formation of a Film Council in Summerside.
 Mr. Clarence E. Mercer, supervisor of the school, acted as chairman and introduced the officials of the National Film Board who were present to outline the proposal. Mr. H. B. Chandler, regional agent, National Film Board and director of visual education, Messrs. John Martin and Stan MacInnis, district representatives of the National Film Board.
 It was the unanimous opinion of the representatives present from the various groups that the council should be formed.
 Mayor Wedge, in supporting the movement, stated that in the event that the council was formed space could be provided at the Town Hall for the storage of films and equipment.
 The advantages of a council in Summerside were pointed out by the visiting officials. At present there are about 1,200 films at Charlottetown, serving about 14,000 people. It was suggested that to begin with about one hundred films would be placed in the Summerside Council. During the first year a projector will be furnished by the department for use in Summerside, and if circulation should warrant it, possibly two projectors.
 Each organization will subscribe a certain fee, the amount of which will be decided after the Film Council has been formed. This money will remain in the funds of the local council to be used for the purchase of a projector which will be used by all member groups. The projectors, which will be on loan to the council, will remain in Summerside until sufficient funds have been collected to purchase one in the town.
 It was stressed that such a council in Summerside would make films of varied interest readily available to local organizations who are members of the council at a moment's notice.
 In order that the representatives of the different organizations could get official sanction from their respective groups, it was decided to hold a further meeting on Wednesday, December 10th, at which time the Film Council will be officially formed, officers elected, and a constitution drawn up.—S.

Civil Cases
 The civil non jury cases J. L. Rayner vs. R. Bruce MacNaught; and J. L. Rayner vs. Eston Waite, both breach of contract cases were both set down for hearing on January 8th.
 In the civil jury cases the Mile End Fruit Exchange Inc., Montreal, with R. S. Hinton as counsel vs. John W. Farmer, represented by M. Alban Farmer and Gordon Hammill (third party) represented by W. Chester S. MacDonald, is a breach of contract case, and a motion by Mr. Hinton was granted by the court setting this case to the foot of the docket.
 The other cases are John J. Moran, with Gerald R. Foster as counsel vs. Island Motor Transport with Kenneth M. Martin, as counsel, in a suit for damages; and the other case is Gerald Doucette, an infant by Joseph Emmanuel Doucette, his next friend, with J. A. Gallant as counsel, vs. Joseph Gerard Bernard (Meteor Taxi) with D. O. Stewart as counsel, in a suit for damages.
 The case of J. L. Rayner vs. R. Bruce MacNaught, on which a reference on a point of law had been made to the Supreme Court, was on the docket and Justice MacGuigan delivered judgment on the points of law that had been referred to the court. He held that Rayner's licence which had allegedly been cancelled by the Potato Board levy, was a valid licence until its expiry date June 30th, 1951.
 This followed the recent judgment of the Supreme Court of Canada which held such a levy to be illegal.
 The effect of this judgment was to make valid all contracts entered into by the plaintiff Rayner up to June 30, 1951, (the expiry date of the licence) as the plaintiff Rayner had no license between June 30, 1951 and November 17, 1951, any contracts entered into by him during that time were held to be invalid.
 The Sheriff's report submitted to the court revealed that 95 persons had been committed to the Prince County Jail since the last regular sitting of the Supreme Court. Of this number, 80 were cases that involved alcoholic beverages.

Grand Jury's Report
 The members of the Grand Jury in their report after inspection of the gaol recommended that oil burners be placed in both heating boilers with the object of maintaining the building in a more cleanly condition and at the same time reducing redecoration costs.
 In addition, it was stressed that better heating equipment should be provided in the cell area.
 They deplored the fact that there is an abnormal number of accidents and fatalities on the highways through the reckless operation of automobiles, and they recommended that the traffic regulations be more strongly enforced, including those in regard to the dimming of headlights.
 The report, in respect to traffic regulations, emphasized the need for more restrictive measures pertaining to those driving automobiles while under the influence of alcoholic beverages.

Would Cut Liquor Before Meetings
 OTTAWA, Nov. 25 — (CP) — Rev. Dan McIvor, a non-drinker, said today that he is no "pious sissy" but he thinks international statesmen should stop sipping cocktails before attending important meetings.
 The 79-year-old United Church minister and Liberal member for Fort William said in the Commons that he had sobered up a lot of men in his day. But he didn't like the idea of statesmen having "three or four rums, or sometimes more, before they go into meetings."
 "Let them drink," he said, "but on their own time. But let them go into committee meetings with a clear brain and their trust in God."
