FIRE IN NEW YORK.

A Great Deal of Damage Done.

NEW YORK, Dec 5.—A fire started here in the Rogers and Peet building last night and spread to the Home Life Insurance building and the postal telegraph building.

At two o'clock the fire was still raging.

An insurance man roughly estimated the loss about as follows:

Rogers, Peet & Co., building and stock, and losses to other tenants in the building, \$350,000.

Home Life Insurance Company, building and losses to other tenants, \$500,000.

Postal Telegraph Company, building and losses to other tenants, \$100,000.

Losses to the surrounding buildings, \$500,000.

Great Britain and the States.

LONDON, Dec 3.—In the course of a speech on Friday evening, Sir Edward Gray referred to "the magnificent effect on the relations between the United States and Great Britain, accomplished by the free press of a free people on each side of the Atlantic, expressing the generous impulses of each nation." He said:

"I would rather have the free play of this national sentiment, which is enriching the public life of both countries, than a written alliance. We have finally come to realize a double patriotism—the patriotism of country and the patriotism of race. There is a common bond between the two peoples; and we should in times of peace to see the sentiment growing, and in times of disturbance to find it something upon which we could lean for mutual support."

Sir Edward Grey condemned the "attempts of some conservative speakers to make party capital out of this understanding," and expressed a hope that both Germany and the United States may incline more and more to our policy of "open doors," which led to a great improvement in trade throughout the world.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

—The Guardian is, apparently, not aware that a portion of Queen's County forms part of the electoral District of East Prince.

—Late despatches state that Japan is making ready for war,—presumably with Russia.

—The Pioneer is authority for the statement that "extra pressure" was put upon Prof. Prince by "Mr. J. H. Bell and Mr. B. D. McLellan, M. P." It would be interesting to know what kind of pressure was used. The Pioneer is unfair. It ought to tell the public all about the matter.

—The Guardian insinuates that THE EXAMINER approves of electoral corruption because we disapproved of its proposed "agreement." This is not kind, nor is it justifiable. We opposed the Guardian's proposal because it has been proved that Liberal election managers cannot be trusted to carry out an agreement, and on the same principle that having found a more to be a rogue we decline to do any man business with him. THE EXAMINER is and always has been in favor of clean and pure elections.

—The war between the GTR and the CPR is ended; and quite unintentionally as a late number of the Ottawa Citizen points out, the railway companies have afforded an excellent example of the possibility of carrying passengers at one-third of the present rates, and not only benefiting the public greatly but also benefiting the railways themselves. The reduction of the rate from three cents a mile to one cent caused the number of people who patronized the railways to increase in more than inverse ratio. The war would not have lasted long if the companies had not discovered that they did not lose money by it. This point is one of which the railway authorities in P. E. Island will do well to make a note.

THE LEVIS ELECTION.

A Great Fight Between the Liberal Factions.

QUEBEC, Dec 5.—The fight between the two factions of the Liberal party over the Levis local election is growing exciting.

Langelier has written to Premier Marchand accusing him of acting treacherously toward the old Liberal guard at the dictation of his colleague, who spurs the power of the Czar of Russia.

Langelier announces that Mayor Prefontaine, M. P. for Montreal, will speak for him at Levis, and that he has the sympathy of Senator Pelletier and Carroll, M. P. for Kamouraska.

This shows that the muddle in the Liberal party in this Province is more widespread than has yet appeared.

The Peace Commission.

PARIS, Dec 3.—Yesterday's session was a repetition virtually of several earlier meetings. When, after two hours of discussion taking a wide range, the Spaniards were pressed for definite statements, they pleaded that they had not received instructions from Madrid. Thereupon the Americans declared in diplomatic phraseology that it was useless to waste time in debate with men who were not empowered to make bargains. Although the adjournment was taken until tomorrow, it is probable that there will be a further postponement to Monday. The Spaniard's version of today's session is that they asked to have the treaty concluded first and then the minor matters discussed. According to the report from American sources, the Spanish commissioners endeavored to draw out hints as to how far the Americans were willing to compromise the demands under consideration, without disclosing what concessions Spain was willing to make.

NEWS NOTES.

Recent statistics show that 579,608 women earn their living in business or industry in Germany. They have to, with a million men or so in the army. It is not a case of new woman, but of necessity.

Remarkable results have been achieved by the government poultry fattening establishment in Carleton Place, near Ottawa. In two and one-half weeks ordinary fowls, taken from run of farm yards, on rations of fine ground oats and skimmed milk, increased their weight to an average of eight pounds.

The Paris correspondent of the Daily News, Emily Crawford, predicts that Court of Cassation will declare the Dreyfus trial irregular and Dreyfus innocent. In her opinion the court will not interfere in the Picquet affair.

Lake Superior is in danger of losing its distinction of being the largest fresh water lake in the world. African explorers begin to think that Lake Victoria Nyanza is larger. Superior covers 31,200 square miles, and Nyanza has been credited with about 30,000; but recent explorations have discovered a hitherto unknown bay on its southern side, which may so increase its area as to make it a question whether it is not larger than Superior. Think of what that great sea, open to commerce all the year round, unlike Superior, will be some day when civilization encircles it.
